ANNUAL HEYMANN NEWSLETTER - 1987

Dear Cousins,

Thanksgiving is a family time of year, and a happy time to think of the family ties which give all our days a warm and happy touch. As we greet this harvest season, we find we all have much to be thankful for this year. With the help of all our Cousins across the United States ... we have good news to report. The Family Church at Hunt's Corners now has a new roof! The old roof was over 40 years old ... so this new one should keep your Church in good shape for many years to come. The new roof, gutters and downspouts were all completed by August 1, 1987. That expense was a VERY big hurdle, but is almost behind us now. We have thus far received 75% of our goal towards the new roof, with the balance paid from prior savings in our treasury. It is our hope to still reach 100% of our goal by the end of the year, as our treasury is now depleted.

There are several improvements under consideration for the future, but nothing of that magnitude. Our ultimate goal is to put the Church back in it's original state, with an eye towards one day perhaps having it declared eligible for placement on the National Register of Historic Places.

CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS:

There are several improvements under consideration for the future including:

3.	Termite precautionary control.	\$ 400.

5.	Erection of perimeter picket fences.	\$1200.
	Erection of replacement steeple.	\$1200.
7.	Rebuild original pulpit.	?

NEW HEYMANN HISTORY BOOK:

We have received many questions about the new book. Work is progressing, with about 65% of the questionnaires returned. Obviously the sooner the forms are all mailed back ... the sooner the book can be completed. We can not get a price on the new book, until it is nearer completion, so they know approximately how many pages it will contain. We will notify all the Cousins, when this project is ready for orders. Please check with your relatives, to be sure they have ALL returned their questionnaires. (More forms can be sent upon request, if yours have been misplaced.) Also ... please tell us any time you or a relative move ... so we can keep our addresses up to date. If someone in your family does not receive this Newsletter ... or has not received a questionnaire ... it is quite likely we do not have their address. We need everyone's help on this.

GIFT IDEAS:

The Heymann Historical Society has on-going expenses each year, for insurance and upkeep etc. on the Family Church. To help offset some of these various expenses, we are pleased to be offering some lovely gift items for sale.

We now have our beautiful Heymann Family Coat of Arms in color, and suitable for framing. The Coat of Arms was adopted by Pastor Johannes Heymann in 1676, and the late Heinrich Heimann of Welle, Germany commissioned a painter to reproduce it for us ... almost 300 years later.

It depicts a shield with a man shouldering a scythe on a silver field. Below is a red field with a silver rune and two stars, each made up of five silver seed grains. The rune and seed grains signify "The Harvest and Blessing". (Very appropriate for this Thanksgiving season.) The upper half of the crest sets forth the meaning of the Heymann name, and the lower half refers to the farmer-peasantry, from which the largest part of our family belonged ... hence a hay-man. The beautiful blue, red and silver colored Coat of Arms can be mailed to you for \$10.00, or mailed direct to a relative, as a gift from you, for Christmas, birthdays, graduations or anniversaries. Just place your order, along with \$10.00 for each Coat of Arms you would like ... and we will mail them for you.

Another excellent gift is a sketch of the Family Church at Hunt's Corners, reproduced on parchment paper, also suitable for framing ... plus a copy of the Church History on the same paper, all for only \$5.00. This too can be mailed as a gift from you to relatives at your request. Both items can solve your shopping problems and gift ideas, for those hard-to-buy-for relatives. Each would make a very original and thoughtful gift, and would give added pleasure to those not fortunate enough to live nearby, to see the Church as often as they would like. Both can be mailed to arrive by Christmas, if you hurry, and place your order no later than December 10th.

FUTURE PROJECTS:

These are exciting times at the Heymann Historical Society, and we want to include each one of you, as we move ahead on all our various projects.

Some of the Cousins have volunteered to paint the Church next summer ... to enhance the new roof, gutters and downspouts. They are to be commended, for their undying efforts in keeping our Family Church in excellent condition ... both inside and out ... year after year.

One of our tentative plans, in the next few years, is a proposed trip to Germany, including a tour of our ancestral Village of Kaltenholzhausen. We thought it might be fun to go together as a group ... and to also cut costs. Several of you Cousins have already been fortunate enough to visit there over the years. We welcome your photos and souvenirs at any of our reunions, so you might share some of these remembrances with your Cousins.

If any of you would be interested in this proposed trip, and have preferences for additional German cities you might like to visit, please let us hear from you. We have a proposed agenda, but are flexible, if a majority of you Cousins have any specific places you prefer visiting. We welcome all input, on any of our projects.
