ANNUAL HEYMANN NEWSLETTER - 1990

Dear Cousins,

With the coming of the Thanksgiving season, it is definitely a time to count our many blessings. This has been a fantastic year for the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY! It started with the Herculean effort by several Cousins, of erecting a new picket fence around the Church property in September 1989 ... and just continued to get better and better throughout the year.

#### NEW PICKET FENCE ERECTED:

At 9:00 A.M. on September 30, 1989, DONALD R. HEYMAN and his brother MARION O. HEYMAN both of Liberty Center, Ohio, arrived with their crew, consisting of DON'S two sons: DANIEL A. HEYMAN and MATTHEW C. HEYMAN both of Grand Rapids, Ohio; DON'S son-in-law KENNETH D. DAVIS of Monclova, Ohio; DON'S two grandsons: JOSHUA A. HEYMAN - DAN'S son and JOSEPH L. HEYMAN - MATT'S son; with friend WILBUR CONRAD, also of Grand Rapids.

They were joined by JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR. of Monroeville, Ohio; MAURICE L. HEYMAN, Worthington, Ohio; WILLIAM F. HEIMAN of Tontogany, Ohio; RICHARD P. REECE, Berlin Heights, Ohio; ROBERT W. SMITH and his son BRADLEY C. SMITH and JACK STRONG all of Monroeville.

Helping out during the day with a generous supply of cold drinks were NORA H. SMITH and MARGARET KISER both of Monroeville. They also served the group chili and hot apple pie for lunch.

The weather was cool but nice - about 65°. They experienced difficulty digging the post holes, but after renting a new Honda post hole digger from Bliele Supply, the problem was solved.

Work was completed at 6:00 P.M., when the exhausted crew finally headed for home. There are no words to truly express the gratitude of all the Cousins - to all of those involved in this mammoth project. Just know we are all extremely pleased with the results ... and extend our many, MANY thanks for all your great teamwork.

On October 9, 1989 ROBERT SMITH returned and spent an additional four hours removing a large tree stump with his own backhoe - so that the final two sections of the fence at the rear of the Church property could be erected in the spring by JOHN SEAMAN.

After letting the new picket fence weather sufficiently, the first coat of white paint was applied in the Spring of 1990 by JOHN SEAMAN in a four-day project. A second coat was to be applied in October by a volunteer group of Cousins - but continued rain postponed the effort until Spring 1991 - after the wood dries out again.

#### MATCHING FUNDS ENDOWMENT:

Along with your Newsletter last year, we enclosed a letter from JOHN SEAMAN, President of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, telling you

about a "Matching Funds" Endowment, which could be made possible from the France Stone Foundation for \$10,000.00. Under this agreement, if we could also raise \$10,000.00 in commitments by December 31, 1989 - the France Stone Foundation would match it with their own \$10,000.00 - with the stipulation these funds remain invested - and that only the interest be used in the future to preserve the Hunt's Corners Church.

Also with JOHN'S letter, there was a Pledge Form enclosed, along with a return envelope addressed to our Treasurer, MAURICE HEYMAN. We had hoped that this goal could somehow be met ... but were overwhelmed with the outpouring of pledges from one end of the United States to the other ... PLUS several from our Cousins in Germany!

I am happy to say that with all of your help ... we WERE able to meet our goal ... and on December 15, 1989, JOSEPH S. HEYMAN of Perrysburg, Ohio, as President of the France Stone Foundation, presented MAURICE L. HEYMAN with a check in the amount of \$10,000.00! These funds have been invested, and the interest is now accumulating, to be on hand for the yearly maintenance costs for the Church.

Many, many thanks to all of you Cousins that have helped make this dream a reality - by sending in your pledges. Most of you have since paid your pledges in full - and to the few who have not as yet paid ... this will serve as a gentle reminder - as we are sure it has just temporarily slipped your mind. #### MEET SOME OF YOUR COUSINS:

As a new feature of your Newsletter ... we are profiling three cousins ... we think you should know a little better.

Laverne S. Heyman of North Fairfield, Ohio (page 79), President Emeritus of the Heymann HISTORICAL SOCIETY, was the youngest of ten children born to LILLIAN EDITH EVANS and WILLIAM CHRISTIAN HEYMAN. He received his education in the Bellevue and Monroeville, Ohio schools.

He entered the U.S. Army in January 1944 at Fort Benjamin Harrison, and was trained as an artillery mechanic at Fort Sill, Oklahoma. He served as a combat engineer at Camp Bowie, Texas, and was later transferred to the Army Air Force, where he trained as an

aircraft and engine mechanic.

He attended gunnery school at Harlingen, Texas, and was later trained as an engineer gunner at Amarillo Army Air Base on a B-17 aircraft. He was later transferred to Lowry Field at Denver, Colorado for advanced armorer training, then back again to Amarillo, where he flew B-17 and B-29 aircraft. At the conclusion of World War II he served in the Military Police at Sheppard Field, and while at Chanute Field in Rantoul, Illinois, was appointed to the Criminal Investigation Division of the Army in the Chicago area until his discharge in May 1946.

He had worked on the Wheeling and Lake Erie Railroad prior to entering military service, so after returning home he was employed in June 1946 on the Pennsylvania Railroad at Sandusky, Ohio. He was promoted to locomotive engineer in November 1956 on steam engines. The Pennsylvania Railroad became first the Penn Central, and later part of ConRail. In October 1985 Laverne retired after spending over

40 years on various railroads.

Laverne was married to JANE POWLEY in 1964. She died in 1980. He is active in numerous organizations, and recently donated funds for one of the trees on the Hunt's Corners Church property. He is a Civil War buff, and a virtual walking encyclopedia on history of all kinds. Laverne was elected the first President of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY in June 1982. Through his generosity he paid all the cash needs for the Hunt's Corners Church for several years including: insurance, taxes, attorney fees, maintenance etc. We owe him a deep debt of gratitude for helping us get our organization off and running. Many, MANY thanks Laverne!

A. PAULINE HEYMANN of Burns, Kansas (page 103), was the oldest of three children born to ALICE VOGELMAN and PAUL HEYMANN in Newton, Kansas. She attended school in De Graff and Burns, and was graduated from El Dorado Junior College in El Dorado, Kansas. In 1941 she was graduated from the University of Kansas Medical Center School of Nursing, and in 1943 received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Kansas at Lawrence.

PAULINE practiced nursing in Chicago, Illinois, El Dorado, Kansas and New Jersey. She attended Teacher's College, Columbia College in New York City, and in 1947 received her Master of Arts degree in Nursing Education.

She was the Supervisor and Instructor of Nursing from 1947 to 1961 at Cornell University's New York Hospital, and became the Assistant Director of Nursing in 1961 at Children's Hospital in Cincinnati, Ohio.

In 1971 there was a severe nursing shortage in the United States, so she was sent to the Philippines to recruit registered nurses. While there she also toured some of the World War II war zones such as Corregidor and Bataan. During this trip she also visited Japan, Hong Kong and Hawaii.

In 1972 she was made Director of Nursing at Children's Hospital Medical Center, where she served in that capacity until her retirement in 1982. While active in nursing she traveled extensively throughout

the United States and Canada on various speaking engagements.

Upon PAULINE'S retirement she returned to the homestead farm of JOHN HENRY HEYMANN in Burns, Kansas, which she and her brother HAROLD PAUL HEYMANN now own. This farm has been in the HEYMANN family for over 100 years. PAULINE raises 300 laying hens and grows fruit, berries and garden vegetables, and now uses her nursing skills in the care of sick animals.

PAULINE was one of the 81 cousins that toured Germany in May 1989. As we all arrived at O'Hare International Airport in Chicago, Illinois, prior to our departure for Germany, it was evident she had done her homework well in advance of the trip ... as she had read the writeup on each one in the family history book, and knew how each one was related. She was a delight to have aboard ... and we all look forward to having her join us again for the next trip. She is a true historian of the HEYMANN family.

HERALD HEYMAN SMITH of El Paso, Texas (page 292) was born in Tiffin, Ohio, the second of two sons born to HAZEL AMELIA HEYMAN and FRANK SMITH. He joined the U.S. Army on July 2, 1931, and became a career officer before his retirement ... 37 years later.

He took a basic officers course in 1940 at Fort Benning, Georgia, and was assigned to the 37th Infantry Division until September 1945. He then held various staff and command positions at Camp Wheeler, Georgia, Fort McClellan, Alabama and Fort Jackson, South Carolina. In July 1946 he was integrated into the Regular Army and attended an Officers Career Course at Fort Benning for one year. From June 1948 to August 1951 he was a staff officer in the 4th U.S. Army at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, and in 1951 he attended a Command and General Staff equivalent course at Air University, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama.

From June 1952 - August 1953 he was Commander of the 2nd Infantry Division in Korea and then became a Staff and Command Officer at Fort Benning for 4 years. From 1957-1958 he served as Post Commander in Nellingham, Germany and G4 Southern Area Command Officer in Munich, Germany from August 1958-July 1960. Upon his return to the United States he became Senior Army Advisor in the State of Missouri until 1964. He then served as Post Commander at Boston Army Base until his retirement in March 1968, after attaining the rank of Colonel.

During HERALD'S military career he received many decorations and service ribbons including: Legion of Merit with one Oak Leaf Cluster; Bronze Star with two Oak Leaf Clusters; Presidential Unit Citation with one Oak Leaf Cluster; Combat Infantryman's Badge with one Star; French Croix de Guerre; Korean Chung Mu; and Philippine Presidential Citation.

HERALD has been a member of many organizations, but one of his favorites was as an adult worker with the Boy Scouts of America for many years, where he holds the Silver Beaver Award. HERALD was the father of three sons, and after his retirement, he and his wife CECILE moved to El Paso, Texas where they still make their home. In August 1990 they journeyed back to Ohio, and visited the Family Church at Hunt's Corners. We're proud to have him as a member of our family.

#### COUSINS FROM GERMANY VISIT OHIO:

The highlight of the year ... without a doubt ... was the May 1990 visit to Ohio by eight of our Cousins from Germany! They included: ANNELORE & RUDI ALTENHOFEN of Arzbach; HILDE & WILLI SCHAFER from Kaltenholzhausen; HANNELORE & THORWALD STARK of Kaltenholzhausen; and ELLEN & RUDOLF WAGNER from Dauborn.

They landed in Florida first and were met by MARY & JACK WILDER of Winter Springs. After touring Florida with the WILDERS, the group headed north towards Ohio in two vans - and arrived at Heymann House Bed & Breakfast on Friday, May 11, 1990.

What an exciting time it was for all of us! They were treated to an old fashioned American cookout Friday evening - followed by a bit of history given by LaVERNE HEYMAN of North Fairfield, Ohio.

On Saturday they took a scenic airplane ride aboard a Cessna 172 courtesy of RONALD E. SCHEID of Shelby, Ohio. Their plane ride included aerial views of the Hunt's Corners Church, Family Cemetery, Heymann House Bed & Breakfast and all the surrounding area.

At noon a group of about 150 Cousins gathered in the Church for introductions and singing - before heading across the road to the barn of WILLIAM C. SEAMAN - where a potluck dinner was served at tables decorated with both American and German flags. Later Laverne Heyman took them on a tour of the Victorian Skilton home in Monroeville, Ohio which he is restoring. The evening was topped off with a delicious dinner held at Ohio's oldest 4th generation restaurant - McClain's - in Bellevue since 1880.

On Sunday REV. LLOYD H. LINDER of Cleveland, Ohio conducted the service in the Hunt's Corners Church with another 150 in attendance. The printed programs and service were in both English and German - with BRUNO SHIRMACHER acting as interpreter. Many gifts were exchanged - including the flag from Kaltenholzhausen, County of Nassau which will be hung in the Hunt's Corners Church.

Following the Church service - a dedication was held in the proposed Memorial Arboretum on the Church grounds. Five beautiful six foot Colorado Blue Spruce trees were dedicated - one for each couple - plus the center one - in memory of PHILIP WILLIAM HEYMANN - our "Christopher Columbus" - who was the first HEYMANN to set foot in America ... in 1847.

After the dedication of the trees - a catered lunch was held across the road in the barn of WILLIAM SEAMAN. Then at 2:00 P.M. a convoy of Cousins headed for the Marblehead Dock of the Neuman Boat Line - for the car ferry to see and tour the 2,800 acres of Kelley's Island. Their tour included a look at the Glacial Grooves at Kelley's Island State Park - which were formed by the pressure of a glacier moving south from Labrador, Canada ... 30,000 years ago!

The group also visited the 1865 German Reformed Church which now houses the Kelley's Island Historical Association. Following the tour of the Island, the group enjoyed dinner in the 1861 Beatty House Bed & Breakfast owned by MARTHA & JIM SEAMAN. After taking one last look at the Island - the Cousins boarded the ferry for the return trip to Marblehead. While there they viewed the 75 foot high 1821 Marblehead Lighthouse - the oldest original lighthouse on the Great Lakes.

Upon their return to Heymann House, the male Cousins modeled their newly purchased 10-gallon Stetson hats in front of the large tepee which had been erected by RICHARD A. NEUMAN of McComb, Ohio. They also posed at the entrance of Heymann House - where both the

American and German flags flew during their visit.

On Monday May 14, 1990 ... all too soon ... it was time for them to depart. The weather had been quite cool - but the warmth in our hearts will be the only thing that will remain etched in all our memories in the years ahead. We only wish they could have all stayed much, much longer! The Welcome Mat will be out for their return!
