Dear Cousins,

It is autumn again and time for the Thanksgiving season. With the family ties that give our days a warm feeling ... we find we have many, many things to be thankful for this year. The HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY has been blessed with continued support in the many on going projects needed to keep your HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH in excellent condition inside and out. Thanks to all of you Cousins ... these worthwhile endeavors continue to move along at a rapid pace.

NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT:

The HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY has been trying since 1984 to have the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH declared eligible for placement on the National Register of Historic Places. In September 1991, after three on site visits to the area, the committee informed us they are considering not just our Church - but also the entire area around State Route #547 and Sandhill Road - known as HUNT'S CORNERS - including Heymann House Bed & Breakfast - the former home of ELIZABETH (LIBBIE) HARTMAN and LOUIS PHILIP HEYMAN - as a NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT. What an exciting thought! It is a long way from completion of course, as it must be approved by the State of Ohio as well as Washington D.C. ... but it is thrilling to even be considered.

RECAP OF CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS:

After the new roof, gutters and downspouts were completed in August 1987, we had seven projects on our agenda including: (1) Installation of plexiglass over both South leaded glass windows on the Church; (2) Termite precautionary control; (3) Erection of a sign; (4) Erection of perimeter picket fences; and (5) Restoration of the original pulpit. These projects have all now been completed ... with your help.

The new sign was erected in August 1988, in memory of HAROLD WAYNE HEYMAN, and was donated by his wife, SADIE ANN LAWLER HEYMAN, and his three daughters and their husbands, MARJORIE HEYMAN & GEORGE BERTICH, Del Mar, California; BERNETTA HEYMAN & RICHARD DEVOS, Cleveland, Ohio; and ILLENE HEYMAN & RICHARD LUTHANEN, formerly of New Lenox, Illinois, now living in Readstown, Wisconsin.

The original Church pulpit was restored in February 1989 by DONALD R. HEYMAN and his brother MARION O. HEYMAN, both of Liberty Center, Ohio.

In September 1989, DON and MARION, plus a crew including: DANIEL A. HEYMAN, MATTHEW C. HEYMAN, JOSHUA A. HEYMAN, JOSEPH L. HEYMAN, and WILBUR CONRAD all of Grand Rapids, Ohio; KENNETH D. DAVIS, Monclova, Ohio;

MAURICE L. HEYMAN, Worthington, Ohio; RICHARD P. REECE, Berlin Heights, Ohio; ROBERT W. SMITH, BRADLEY C. SMITH, JACK STRONG and JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR. all of Monroeville, Ohio; and WILLIAM F. HEIMAN, Tontogany, Ohio erected the new picket fence ... so the boundries of the Church property are now well defined. NORA H. SMITH and MARGARET KISER both of Monroeville, furnished the food and beverages during that long, long day.

The new picket fence received it's first coat of white paint by JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR., president of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, who spent 4 days solo on that chore, in the Spring of 1990 - just prior to the visit

of our eight Cousins from Germany in May 1990.

Half of the second coat of paint was applied in June 1991 by JOHN SEAMAN, joined by MAURICE L. HEYMAN and PEARL J. SCHWOCHOW of Clyde, Ohio, ... in spite of the severe heat during that time. Then CLEO HEYMAN of Napoleon, Ohio and JOHN SEAMAN completed the job in October 1991.

On May 1, 1991 the Landscape Committee held a meeting at Heymann House Bed & Breakfast. They had all planned to participate in a "paint party" following their meeting - to put the second coat of white paint on the picket fence - but were rained out ... by about the only rain that fell there during the entire summer.

PEARL SCHWOCHOW, Chairman of the Clyde, Ohio Beautification Committee, brought a sample plaque to the meeting. It was decided we would use plaques like these for our new Memorial Arboretum. Cost is

\$25.00 per plaque.

LAVERNE HEYMAN donated funds for four plaques for the beautiful Colorado Blue Spruce trees, which were dedicated in May 1990, to commemorate the visit of our eight Cousins from Germany. These plaques for ANNELORE & RUDI ALTENHOFEN of Arzbach; HILDE & WILLI SCHAFER of Kaltenholzhausen; HANNELORE & THORWALD STARK, also of Kaltenholzhausen; and ELLEN & RUDOLF WAGNER of Dauborn, were put in place following the September 29, 1991 Board Meeting.

Funds for two more plaques were donated during the August 4, 1991 JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN REUNION. One for the fifth Colorado Blue Spruce tree also dedicated in May 1990 for the first HEYMANN to set foot in America in 1847 ... PHILIP WILLIAM HEYMANN.

The second plaque was for his father, JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN, who arrived with his family in 1848. Funds for a sturdy Oak tree were donated at the August 1990 JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN REUNION to commemorate the anniversary of his 195th birthday. It seemed a fitting gift - since JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN had donated the land the Church now stands on - as well as the grounds surrounding it - which includes the new Memorial Arboretum. This property was some of the first land owned by HEYMANNS in America.

The seventh plaque was put in place for the Flowering Crab Apple tree, donated on the occasion of the 50th Golden Wedding Anniversary of VIOLET & MELVIN HERNER of Bellevue, Ohio, by their three daughters and their husbands, RITA HERNER & THOMAS BOALS of Boise, Idaho; NANCY HERNER & FRANK OSBORN of Bellevue, Ohio; and BONNIE HERNER & DR. DUANE PETERSON of Erie, Michigan. In spite of the severe heat and drought this past summer ... all trees seem to be doing well... and now look even nicer with their new commemorative plaques.

Electricity was reconnected after some new wiring was installed in 1990, so that lights and the electric organ are available for all functions throughout the year.

A new Church organ was donated in May 1990 by our organist and Board Member, RICHARD P. REECE of Berlin Heights, Ohio. Thank you for your

thoughtfulness RICHARD.

ANOTHER WEDDING IN THE CHURCH:

On Saturday, June 15, 1991, another wedding was held in your HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH, when CAROL ANN COWIE and DOUGLAS WILLIAM MATHEWS were united in marriage by the REVEREND CHARLES HOWARD. Lots of lovely music resounded from the Church during the ceremony, including favorite works by Bach, Grieg, Handel and Mozart, which were selected by CAROL and DOUG to reflect the joyful festivites of the day.

DOUG is the son of ALTHEA M. MATHEWS of Lorain, Ohio and Largo, Florida, and the late WILLIAM A. MATHEWS. Those of you traveling on the first "Cousins Trip To Germany" will remember ALTHEA as a delightful addition to our group.

PROFILE OF A BOARD MEMBER:

PEARL JOYCE HEYMAN SCHWOCHOW, daughter of EMMA and JACOB PAUL HEYMAN, has held several civil service jobs and was a medical secretary from 1968-1982. She is chairman and member of the Clyde, Ohio Landscape Committee (Tree Commission) and active in tree planting and maintenance in her city. She is also a member of the Landscape Committee for the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, and was instrumental in acquiring the commemorative plaques for the seven newly planted trees in the Memorial Arboretum on the grounds of the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH.

PEARL is married to NORMAN SCHWOCHOW, former Mayor of Clyde, Ohio (1973-1978), Clyde city councilman for 14 years and retired as a cost accountant from the Whirlpool Corporation in Clyde after 43 years of service. They are the parents of two sons - EUGENE and STEPHEN SCHWOCHOW.

PEARL'S mother, EMMA DOERNER, lived next door to Heymann House, prior to her marriage to JACOB PAUL HEYMAN. PEARL says she feels "vibes" when inside the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH, knowing her father and grandfather

worshipped there.

After her father's death, when PEARL was only 1 year old, her mother EMMA took PEARL and her sister JOYCE on the streetcar out of Bellevue, got off at Sandhill Road, and they walked to her grandfather's house many, many times. Needless to say HUNT'S CORNERS holds a lot of fond childhood memories for her.

PEARL and her son STEPHEN were among the 81 on the first "Cousins Trip to Germany" in May 1989, and it was a pleasure for all of us to get acquainted with them during our historic tour.

MEET SOME OF YOUR COUSINS:

As a continuing feature of your Newsletter ... we are profiling three Cousins ... we think you should know a little better.

MILFORD ROY HEYMAN of Riverside, California, the only son of MINNIE HERNER and ALBERT FRANK HEYMAN (page 79), served in the U.S. Army during World War I. He was graduated from Miami University at Oxford, Ohio in 1922 with a B.A. degree and earned his Master of Business Administration degree in 1923 from Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois. He was employed by Equifax Corporation in their insurance department in Chicago, Illinois and was in charge of investigations in the southwest one fourth portion of the City of Chicago. In 1946 he was transferred to California until his retirement in 1965.

In 1965 he started a second career in professional photography and produced about 30 shows with music and narration. These professional appearances were presented to many travel clubs, schools, churches, womens clubs and prominent retirement homes in California, including some in Hollywood. He also presented a show in Las Vegas, Nevada before a large business group. He retired from this second career in 1984 ... at 85 years young!

MILFORD was married to ALICE E. WOOLERY and they were the parents of a daughter, DIANNE LOUISE HEYMAN. DIANNE makes her home with her husband, RODNEY JONES, in Union, Oregon and her two sons reside in

Seattle, Washington.

MILFORD and his wife ALICE were known as "The Heymans - Artists With The Color Camera". ALICE passed away in 1987 at 87 years of age. MILFORD still makes his home at Riverside, California and will celebrate his 93rd birthday on Saint Patrick's Day ... March 17, 1992.

RUTH ELIZABETH WHISLER GILPIN of Treasure Island, Florida, the only daughter of MARY SMITH and WILLIAM WHISLER (page 83), received her Bachelor of Oratory from the Byron W. King School in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

RUTH showed outstanding talent in dramatics and music at an early age. Following college she worked for two years for the famous Jean Gros

French Marionette Company as a puppeteer.

In 1940 she married DONALD C. GILPIN, and together they produced puppet and marionette shows for over 30 years, including a tour with the USO during World War II in the European theater, and later eight years in Atlanta, Georgia with a daily show on WSB Television.

They have traveled extensively with their work and for pleasure, including as tour directors for European Education Study Tours of Puppet Theaters abroad. They are members of Puppeteers of America, National Association of Education Broadcasters, and RUTH was a member of American Women in Radio and Television.

They donated 138 pieces of their puppetry to the Center for Puppetry Arts in Atlanta, and were later honored with an exhibit in that museum with five of their leading marionette characters. RUTH retired from 50 years of puppetry. Both are active and since retirement are frequent participants in Elderhostel programs around the country. RUTH has been a dedicated supporter of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY and has entertained many Cousins of all ages at family reunions over the years.

ROBERT DOUGLAS MOORE of Burlingame, California, the second son of CARRIE BELL LEE and GUSTAVUS ADOLPHUS MOORE (page 117) attended the University of California Agricultural College at Davis. When his parents moved to San Francisco, he attended the American Institute of Banking, where he later taught classes in banking and analyzing financial statements.

In 1924 he was employed by the Anglo London Paris National Bank, and in 1926 he joined the Bank of Italy, later known as Bank of America, where he worked for over 41 years. He became assistant vice president and manager of the installment loan department in the San Francisco main office until his retirement on February 1, 1968.

BOB was married to ELIZABETH CAROLYN GILL, who passed away in 1983. They were the parents of a daughter, JOAN MARLENE MOORE. JOAN makes her home with her husband, ROBERT VERNON JAMES, and their three children in Salem, Oregon

BOB was a member of the Society of Certified Consumers Credit Executives; president and member of the Exchange Club of San Francisco; Commonwealth Club of San Francisco and the Sons in Retirement; and on the Board of Directors of the California State Exchange Clubs. He was made a life member and is past president of the Retail Credit Managers of San Francisco, and was president of District Eleven, covering California, Oregon, Washington, Nevada and Hawaii. He is also a member of the United Bay Area Crusade, where he is affiliated with the San Mateo Children's Home for retarded children and adults.

BOB and his daughter JOAN were among the group of 81 who traveled together on the first "Cousins Trip To Germany". Although he looks a young 65 ... he none the less won the prize for being the oldest on our tour ... at 86 years of age! He seemed to have boundless energy ... and could run circles around the rest of us ... but won the hearts of all.

PORTRAITS PRESENTED TO HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY:

Last year HENRIETTA HEYMAN of Petaluma, California donated two portraits of her grandparents, KATHERINE SCHEID and JOHN HENRY HEYMANN, who were married August 20, 1855 ... 136 years ago. The portraits were done about 1858.

They were the parents of 15 children, including two sets of twins, before KATHERINE'S death, after only 27 years of marriage. KATHERINE and five of her children that died in infancy are all buried in the HUNT'S CORNERS CEMETERY located on Sandhill Road ... just south of the Church.

Both portraits needed restoring ... and HOPE E. KUSHMAUL of Pittsford, Michigan agreed to do the task, donating her time and labor. She did an excellent job, and the portraits were unveiled at the JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN Reunion held Sunday, August 4, 1991 at Grand Rapids, Ohio. HENRIETTA'S sister MARGARET HEYMAN MCNAMEE, and her husband DEL MCNAMEE of Wichita, Kansas, were there to see the finished product and were very, very pleased. The two portraits were later hung the same afternoon in the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH by them and JOHN SEAMAN, President of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY. A big thank you to all the grandchildren of JOHN HENRY for their fine gift. Now each visitor to the Church can also enjoy them. Plus a much deserved thank you to HOPE KUSHMAUL ... for restoring both frames. They really look beautiful!

JOHN HENRY HEYMANN was 19 years of age when he came to America in 1848 with his parents, MARIA MARGARETA OPPERMANN and JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN. He settled first in Ohio where he was engaged in farming and also owned and operated a flour mill and saw mill. At 22 years of age he was taken with "California Gold Fever" and in 1851 he and two friends headed out

west - by way of the Isthmus of Panama.

He remained in California for four years before returning to Ohio where he purchased a farm of 190 acres north of Hunt's Corners, which he paid for in pure gold he brought from California. He and KATHERINE were then married. After her death in 1882, JOHN HENRY was married for the second time to JOHANNETTE ELIZABETH HEIMANN in 1883. They were the parents of four children ... making JOHN HENRY the father of a total of 19 children.

In 1886 he and JOHANNETTE and the younger children moved to Kansas where he continued to farm and raise sheep. The older children remained in Ohio. JOHN HENRY came to Kansas by train and brought livestock and lumber from his saw mill in Ohio to build his house and buildings for livestock. Two of his farms are still in the Heymann family. A grandson, HAROLD HEYMANN, lives on one farm ... and great grandson, J.C. HEYMAN, lives on the other. JOHN HENRY HEYMANN died in 1914 at 85 years of age in his home six miles south of Burns, Kansas, and is buried in the cemetery next to the Ebenezer German Methodist Church, five miles southwest of Burns.

SADIE ANN HEYMAN, formerly of Monroeville, Ohio, and widow of HAROLD HEYMAN, died May 23, 1991 at 95 years of age. Their home was the site of many HEYMAN Reunions over the years - including the first homecoming and


