Dear Cousins,

The work on the Basement project for the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH has now been completed. Hallelujah! The contractor, Stang Builders, did an excellent job - and also cleaned and raked the property around the CHURCH so well - few could tell that the soil had been disturbed only a short time before. As promised - they finished the job by July 31, 1993 - just in time for our CHURCH services on Sunday, August 1, 1993, prior to the JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN REUNION held on the grounds of HEYMANN HOUSE BED & BREAKFAST - just around the corner South. We owe CHASE HEYMAN, Board Member and Chairman of the project, a large debt of gratitude, for furnishing his own backhoe to help on expenses. CHASE was ably assisted by President JOHN SEAMAN and Board member ROBERT SMITH - as they all worked together with the contractor on this extremely important project - and were able to complete it on time. Many, many thanks to all of you from all the Cousins for a job well done!

Then in September our "COUSINS 2ND TRIP TO EUROPE" group joined our cousins in Germany for a fantastic gathering - with endless food, pastries and entertainment we will never forget! They really rolled out the red carpet for us ... and then some ... with a brass band, choral group and period costumes. It was all incredible! How we wish each one of you could have somehow been there to revel in the enjoyment of it all with us. Everyone had a wonderful time.

To really top off the visit ... our annual HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY Board Meeting was held for the first time in the CASTLE AT BURGSCHWALBACH ... which was built by HEYMANNS in the 15th Century! This was arranged by Board Member RUDOLF WAGNER of Dauborn, Germany ... and we thank him very much. It really gave us an extra warm feeling of family continuity. We hope that we will have a chance to again hold a Board Meeting there ... sometime in the not too distant future.

Now as we all get back to our regular work - we are still inspired by all the loving hard work our cousins in Germany provided during this past year. They have truly outdone themselves. Thank you again from all of us. We shall never forget their wonderful hospitality. This has really been a great year of teamwork ... both here and abroad.

## NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT:

We are happy to report that the intersection of STATE ROUTE #547 and SANDHILL ROAD - known as HUNT'S CORNERS - has indeed been approved by the OHIO HISTORIC PRESERVATION BOARD in Columbus, and was entered into the NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES by the NATIONAL PARK SERVICE,

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, as of September 2, 1993! Hurrah!

This area includes, among other places, the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH (now our HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY) plus HEYMANN HOUSE BED & BREAKFAST - the former home of ELIZABETH (LIBBIE) HARTMAN and LOUIS PHILIP HEYMAN - the grandparents of JOHN PHILIP SEAMAN, SR., President of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY. We hope to eventually have some signs erected locally at some future date. Our thanks to SHARI L. BOWERS for pursuing the research on this project, and helping make it all possible. It is a truly exciting event ... and one that our ancestors most assuredly would have wholeheartedly approved.

## CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS:

With the work on the CHURCH Basement now behind us - it is time to proceed with our original new Steeple project. That had to go on the back burner until the foundation work was completed. In keeping with restoring the CHURCH to its original state ... we can now concentrate on new bids for this long awaited, wonderful addition.

## MEMORIAL ARBORETUM:

More things have been added this past year in honor of relatives in the new MEMORIAL ARBORETUM adjoining the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH.

CECILE passed away January 20, 1993 at the William Beaumont Army Medical Center. She was a former registered nurse, and was buried in the Fort Bliss National Cemetery.

Both the Commemorative Park Bench and the Park Post Light will be beautiful additions to the MEMORIAL ARBORETUM ... and a most lasting tribute to a loved one. Funds for those items have now been secured, and will be completed by the Spring of 1994. - 4. Glass Display Case for the back of the CHURCH for Family Bibles, Photos and other Memorabilia.
- 5. New Evergreens or Shrubs around the new Foundation of the CHURCH.
- 6. New signs for the NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT of HUNT'S CORNERS.

## "COUSINS 2ND TRIP TO EUROPE"

On September 21, 1993, we gathered in our luxurious American Airlines VIP Room at O'Hare International Airport in Chicago from 10 states - including Arizona, Colorado, Florida, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio and Oregon. We were soon off on an incredible two week journey to visit many cities - both large and small - and also enjoy the beautiful Autumn countryside of Germany and Austria.

We were most fortunate to get KARL SCHLEDERER as our TOUR DIRECTOR for a second time. Since KARL was born in Salzburg, Austria, and he and his family have been living in Munich, Germany for several years, he was a natural to show us many extra sights in those areas.

We arrived at the Berlin Tegel Airport, and spent two nights in the Berlin Radisson Plaza Hotel, overlooking the Berlin Cathedral, situated on the Spree River in the former Eastern sector of Berlin. We walked through the Brandenburg Gate, and toured the famous Pergammon Museum.

In West Berlin we visited the Charlottenburg Palace and Olympic Stadium of Jesse Owens' 1936 fame. Checkpoint Charlie is now part of a museum, and remains of the Kaiser-Wilhelm Cathedral, provided a stark reminder of some of the terrible, needless destruction of World War II.

In historic Potsdam we considered ourselves extremely fortunate to be able to tour the San Souchi Palace - as we learned there is now a two year wait to get inside! In Leipzig we were privileged to listen to the world renown St. Thomas Choir, during one of their rehearsals in the St. Thomas Church - where Johann Sebastian Bach was their church organist!

While enroute to Jena, Germany, we stopped off to visit the Village of Pegau - the birthplace of MINNIE PEGAU Heyman's family - mother of cousin VERENA HEYMAN DOAK, of Santa Fe, New Mexico. Since all of this area had been in the former Eastern sector - it gave us a chance to see some of the countryside in that area - much of it untouched in 50 years. Then we were off to Frankfurt and a visit to their Old Town Square.

We won't soon forget our wonderful afternoon at Dauborn - and our hosts ELLEN and RUDOLF WAGNER, HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY Board Member, and our Continental Affairs Chairman. The American flag, Ohio State flag and the German flag greeted us - and the tables were laden with delectable pastries - each one tastier then the last! Next we visited the farm of KLAUS DIETER HEIMANN, the only son of OTTO KARL HEIMANN, and toured cousin OTTO's Dauborn Family Distillery while RUDOLF's daughter JUTTA gave us a history of the distillery. After our tour, we were all able to sample some of their specialties at their wine tasting tables.

Then it was time to visit the Arzbach home of cousins ANNELORE & RUDI ALTENHOFEN near Bad Ems. After a toast of champagne - we were serenaded by a brass band and choral group outside their home. Then we departed for the huge tent, erected in the woods near their home. Here we were served a sumptuous dinner - complete with more entertainment!

Much too soon it was time to leave for our hotel in Wiesbaden - to prepare for our Sunday visit in our ancestral Village of Kaltenholzhausen where we would attend services in the Family Church. INGRID & MAYOR REINHOLD ZIMMERMANN greeted us, and following the Church service, we strolled through the Village. Photos were taken in front of the 1794 ancestral home of KATHARINA DOROTHEA HOLZER and JOHANN WILHELM HEYMANN - and our "Friendship Tree" - which was planted with the help of each Cousin's spade of dirt on May 21, 1989, during the "COUSINS 1ST TRIP TO GERMANY". Now with much loving care ... my how it has grown!

Then we went next door to the 100 year old home of Cousin HILDE & WILLI SCHAFER, where along with their son ERHARD SCHAFER, and HANNELORE & THORWALD STARK, we were met by a period-costumed group in blue attire including WILLI, the former Mayor of Kaltenholzhausen. We were each served a glass of wine as we entered, and then served a delicious lunch. Flags, banners and the Family Coat of Arms etc. greeted us - with more

musical entertainment - and a good time was had by all!

After lunch the Board Members of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY held their annual Board Meeting in the CASTLE AT BURGSCHWALBACH, which was built by HEYMANNS in the 15th century. The rest of the cousins toured Burgschwalbach - and also visited their 1,000 year old church, where the name of JOHANNES HEYMANN (1619-1690) and Parson of Duchy Nassau, inscription appears on the wall ... dated 1678.

Then it was time for the lavish 10 course "RITTERMAHL" Knights Dinner festivities, which was planned by RUDOLF WAGNER. What fun that

During our two nights in Innsbruck, Austria we attended a Tyrolean Folk Festival, and also ascended the 7,000 feet Nordketten Alp by Train and Cable Car, for a spectacular view of the city of Innsbruck! Our tour of Salzburg, Austria enabled us to visit the birthplace of Mozart, their Fortress founded in 1077, and many sites for the movie "Sound of Music".


