ANNUAL NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER - 1994

Dear Cousins,

What an incredible year this has been for the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY! First the Basement project for the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH was completed July 31, 1993 ... and now our CHURCH is sporting a brand new Steeple ... as of Thursday, September 22, 1994! It looks positively beautiful! In this Thanksgiving season we have much to be thankful for.

During one of the preliminary meetings of Board members with the architects et al, Board member ROBERT SMITH of Monroeville, Ohio produced an early photo of the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH - with its original octagon shaped Steeple - with scalloped cedar siding. This was a big help in determining the design of the new Steeple - as we were most anxious to keep the restoration as historically accurate as possible - since the CHURCH is now part of the NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT.

The architect was CHARLES M. EFFINGER of Norwalk, Ohio, with his assistant DANIEL J. FREDERICK. The engineering report was provided by DAVE BICKLEY of BIC ENGINEERING, and the material and labor were supplied by STANG BUILDERS, with SAROSH SAHER representing the OHIO HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICE.

First a folding staircase had to be built, to enable the workers to gain entrance to the Bell Tower. Then BOB JORDON of BARBER & HOFFMAN, STRUCTURAL ENGINEERS from Cleveland, Ohio suggested a steel plate needed to be installed next - to support the Bell Tower and Steeple load - between the exterior wall and the interior truss - which STANG BUILDERS did.

Board member ELDEN PLUE of Livonia, Michigan donated the aluminum baked-on white enamel finish Cross atop the new Steeple - in memory of his grandfather SAMUEL HEYMAN - which now makes it look complete.

BOB WINOVICH of WESTERN RESERVE LIGHTNING ROD COMPANY furnished the unseen lightning rod, which was attached to the back face of the Cross. STANG BUILDERS installed the lightning rod onto the Cross, and attached the cable to the lightning rod, prior to the placement of the Steeple atop the Bell Tower.

At 8:00 A.M. Thursday, September 22, 1994, about 30 cousins watched as the large crane was extended straight up to it's fullest capacity and the Steeple was put in place. What a joyous moment that was for all! A lot of proud photos were taken during the erecting of the new Steeple during all the stages. The scaffolding remained for another week, until all the roof work was completed, but now the CHURCH looks like it has always had this beautiful Steeple and white Cross.

Many thanks to the local Board members for all the hours and hard work they have given during this past year, to make this dream a reality.

Additional thanks must also go to the many cousins who have contributed generously to this wonderful project, and with Memorials to loved ones from across the United States and Germany. They must all be so very proud today. Without your help ... none of this would be possible.

HISTORY OF HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH:

In the late 1840s and early 1850s several German families emigrated to this country from Germany and settled in the area of HUNT'S CORNERS. JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN and his family were among this group. His eldest son PHILIP WILLIAM HEYMANN would become the COLUMBUS of the HEYMANN family when he emigrated here in 1847, paving the way for his parents MARIA MARGARETA OPPERMANN and JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN and their five youngest children - JOHN GEORGE, JOHN HENRY, JOHN PHILIP, KATHERINE and WILLIAM FREDERICK HEYMANN - to make the trip the next year ... in 1848.

Being of a religious nature, and since there was no church, the families from Germany got together, and on September 11, 1858, a constitution was adopted with 21 signatures to take turns meeting in their various homes to conduct their worship services. Then on March 28, 1863 papers of incorporation were drawn up with JOHN PHILIP HEYMAN, JOHN HENRY HEYMAN and REV. CHARLES KUSS appointed to the building committee.

On June 6, 1866 JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN donated the land upon which the CHURCH was built, that was some of the first land owned by HEYMANNS in the United States. WILLIAM CONRAD HEYMANN of WEAVER'S CORNERS donated some of the timber from his farm used in the building - which was sawed out of the mill of JOHN GEORGE WILLIAM HEYMANN in Sherman Township.

The CHURCH was erected by members of the congregation, and was to be known as the GERMAN EVANGELICAL REFORMED ST. PAUL'S CHURCH. On January 4, 1872, upon a motion, the name was changed to the GERMAN EVANGELICAL REFORMED ZOAR'S CHURCH. The congregation became a community gathering place for well over a century, for Protestant German people who favored the German Reform Church. In the early days the services were conducted in German, but as the younger generations began to speak more and more English - the services were later done in English.

In 1980-1982 the congregation became too small to support the CHURCH, and it was in danger of being sold, moved or razed. The congregation did not want to see this happen - and neither did the HEYMANN family - so the HEYMAN HISTORICAL SOCIETY was formed, with the primary objective being to preserve the CHURCH. On June 10, 1982 JOSEPH S. HEYMAN, Attorney at Law in Toledo, Ohio, prepared the transfer deed papers, which were signed by ALVIN D. SHELLEY, President of the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH, and NORA E. SMITH, Secretary - with the additional signatures of the members at that time. The HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH then officially became the property of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY.

Each HEYMAN or HEYMAN-related person is an automatic member of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY. Since 1982 the CHURCH has been beautifully maintained inside and out with contributions of love, labor and cash by continued support of the members of the SOCIETY.

NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT:

The HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY received a confirmation letter from the OHIO HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICE in Columbus, Ohio dated October 26,

1993 to confirm that HUNT'S CORNERS had indeed been entered into the NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES by the NATIONAL PARK SERVICE, DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR as of September 2, 1993.

In a letter dated November 18, 1993, Ohio State Senator ALAN J. ZALESKI congratulated the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY on their national recognition of property with historic value in the 13TH DISTRICT OF OHIO.

We are all most proud of the hard work of all those involved in making the area of the intersection of STATE ROUTE #547 and SANDHILL ROAD, known as HUNT'S CORNERS, and located in Lyme Township west of Monroeville, Ohio in Huron County, now designated an HISTORIC DISTRICT.

This area includes, among other places, the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH (now our HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY) plus HEYMANN HOUSE BED & BREAKFAST - the former home of ELIZABETH (LIBBIE) HARTMAN and LOUIS PHILIP HEYMAN - the grandparents of JOHN PHILIP SEAMAN, SR., President of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY. We hope to have a sign erected locally at some future date with a Post Light donated by REVA JUNE & ROBERT NASBY.

We are deeply grateful to W. RAY LUCE, Chief of the OHIO HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICE, and currently serving as President of the NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICES, for his help in

approving our nomination.

We were also quite pleased to see a nice article and photo of the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH and picket fence enclosed MEMORIAL ARBORETUM property, submitted by SHARI BOWERS for the Spring 1994 issue of ECHOES, an OHIO HISTORICAL SOCIETY newsletter from Columbus. It is nice to have State recognition for all the worthwhile work done by local cousins, and supported by continued contributions from all of you across the USA and Germany. What a wonderful close-knit family we are. I'm sure our ancestors would be most proud.

WEDDINGS IN THE HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH:

The HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH continues to be a favorite site for weddings of relatives and friends. JOAN CRAFT and ROBERT UHLMANN chose the CHURCH as the place to repeat their marriage vows on Saturday, April 30, 1994, and held their reception at HEYMANN HOUSE BED & BREAKFAST.

The DARLENE SKIDMORE family also chose the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH for the site of wedding nuptials on Saturday, May 21, 1994. We are happy to

see the CHURCH used for so many happy occasions.

MEMORIAL ARBORETUM:

More things have been added this past year in honor of relatives in the new MEMORIAL ARBORETUM adjoining the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH. On Sunday, August 7, 1994 the members of the JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN REUNION were on hand to mark the dedication of the new Commemorative Park Post Light in honor of DAVID ALLAN HYMAN of Paulding, Ohio, given by his wife and family - JACKIE HYMAN and children, RACHEL, ERIN, GRETCHEN, HARVEY D. and JAMES HYMAN of Paulding.

Also on August 7, 1994, under the auspices of the REV. PAUL DEPPEN of Elmore, Ohio, a Flower Bed and Sun Dial were dedicated with a plaque reading: IN CELEBRATION OF THE HEYMANN COUSINS' 2ND TRIP TO GERMANY. This contribution was given by Board Member PEARL JOYCE HEYMAN and NORMAN SCHWOCHOW, who planted a beautiful bed of Tulips in the Spring of 1994. This contribution just happened to coincide with their 50th Golden Wedding Anniversary celebrated on October 30, 1993. PEARL is a member of the Landscape Committee for the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY and NORM is the former Mayor of Clyde, Ohio. JOHN SEAMAN later planted a bed of Marigolds which were enjoyed by all during the Summer and Fall months.

Our thanks to all of you over the past few years. You have added to the beauty of the CHURCH and the MEMORIAL ARBORETUM, thus providing not only enjoyment for all the cousins, but to anyone that passes that way.

A second Commemorative Park Bench is being provided - as well as a second Commemorative Park Post Light - in loving memory of CECILE MARY SMITH - by her husband HERALD HEYMAN SMITH of El Paso, Texas. CECILE passed away January 20, 1993 at the WILLIAM BEAUMONT ARMY MEDICAL CENTER. She was a former registered nurse, and was buried in the FORT BLISS NATIONAL CEMETERY.

Both the Commemorative Park Bench and the Park Post Light will be beautiful additions to the MEMORIAL ARBORETUM ... and a most lasting tribute to a loved one. Now you can sit and meditate, while enjoying the beautiful surroundings in the MEMORIAL ARBORETUM. Our thanks to all of you for your thoughtfulness.

CHRISTMAS AT HUNT'S CORNERS:

In case you have not yet had a chance to visit the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH - we urge you to drive past during the Christmas season, and enjoy the lights shining through our beautiful Leaded Glass Windows each night. On the outside a spotlight bathes the two front doors with their two large wreaths and red bows. Small white lights and garlands with red bows festoon the white picket fence, while more white lights adorn the evergreens in the MEMORIAL ARBORETUM. The CHURCH is located just SOUTH of U.S. Route #20 - at 4550 on ROUTE #547 - EAST of Bellevue, Ohio - and WEST of Monroeville, Ohio. It is easy to see, whether you are traveling North and South along SANDHILL ROAD - or East and West along ROUTE #547. NOTE: The HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY Sign has been removed for the Winter to receive a new coat of paint. It will be back again in the Spring.

FUTURE CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS:

Our "Wish List" had formerly included a new Foundation for the CHURCH; a new CHURCH Steeple; a second Commemorative Park Bench and a second Commemorative Park Post Light for the MEMORIAL ARBORETUM; and a Glass Display Case for the CHURCH to hold family memorabilia. Thanks to all of you - these items have now been completed, and with loving support from so many of you - our "Wish List" of items under consideration for the CHURCH has continued to shrink each year - and at this time there are only 4 items still needed including:

1. New Brick Sidewalk on CHURCH Property.

- Restoration Funds for the HUNT'S CORNERS CEMETERY straighten monuments - and Wrought Iron Fence with name of the CEMETERY.
- 3. New Evergreens or Shrubs around the new Foundation of the CHURCH.
- 4. New signs for the NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT of HUNT'S CORNERS.

PROFILE OF A BOARD MEMBER:

ELDEN HEYMAN PLUE of Livonia, Michigan (page 139) was the only child and son of FLORENCE MCKINLEY HEYMAN and RALPH PLUE. He was graduated from Western High School in Detroit, Michigan, received his Bachelor of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering in 1951 from the University of Detroit, and served in the U.S. Air Force as a 2nd Lt. from 1951 to 1953.

ELDEN married his high school sweetheart LENORE MAY HODGES, who received a degree in Home Economics from Wayne State University. After a 5 year dating period, and their college graduations, they were married in 1951 and celebrated their 43rd wedding anniversary in May 1994. They are the parents of three married children: ROGER ALLEN (SUSAN) PLUE of Fenton, Michigan; ELLEN LEIGH PLUE (JOHN) NIEMISTO of Livonia, Michigan; and ROBERT SCOTT PLUE also of Livonia; and have 3 granddaughters: KATRINA

NIEMISTO, age 8; LAUREN PLUE, age 7; and HANNAH PLUE, age 4 years.

ELDEN was employed as manager of Sales and Engineering for DETROIT TUBE PRODUCTS in Detroit until his retirement in December 1993, after 50 years of service. He has been a Board Member of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY since 1989, and like his mother FLORENCE before him, has been a staunch supporter of the organization. When the new Steeple on the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH was being erected in September 1994, ELDEN volunteered to furnish a white Cross for the top of the Steeple, in memory of his grandfather SAMUEL HEYMANN. It really made the CHURCH look beautiful and complete. Many thanks ELDEN from all the Cousins.

ELDEN and LENORE were among the group of 81 on the "COUSINS 1ST TRIP TO GERMANY" in May 1989, and also joined the group on the "COUSINS 2ND TRIP TO EUROPE" in September/October 1993, when they toured castles, cathedrals and cities throughout Germany and Austria, in addition to

visiting the ancestral Village of Kaltenholzhausen, Germany.

They enjoyed camping as a family for many years, and now have a lake cottage near Brighton, Michigan, and are active in the Rosedale Gardens Presbyterian Church in Livonia, Michigan where they make their home.

MEET SOME OF YOUR COUSINS:

As a continuing feature of your NEWSLETTER ... we are profiling three Cousins ... we think you should know a little better.

JUDGE JAMES PERRY HORN of Elyria, Ohio (page 263) was the second child and second son of EUNICE EASTON and PHILIP HORN. He received his elementary education at Monroeville, Ohio and was graduated from East High School in Cleveland, Ohio. He received his A.B. degree from Western Reserve University, earned his J.D. degree in law from Ohio State University in Columbus and served in the U.S. Naval Reserves as Lieutenant jg. from April 1944 to March 1946.

JIM was married in the Old Stone Church at Cleveland to LOUISE ELLA REISING, a registered nurse from the M.B. Johnson School of Nursing in Elyria. They were the parents of 3 children: PHILIP JAMES HORN, of Elyria; twin NANCY LOUISE HORN (ROBERT) THOMPSON of Las Vegas, Nevada; twin NEIL LEWIS (MARY JANE) HORN of Maumee, Ohio; and 6 grandchildren: CELESTE MICHELLE THOMPSON; CHRISTOPHER MICHAEL THOMPSON; KEVIN MILO THOMPSON; CELIA MONIQUE THOMPSON of Las Vegas; MICHAEL CALVIN HORN; and KATHLEEN LOUISE HORN of Maumee, Ohio.

JIM was an attorney in Elyria and held several public offices including: Referee for the Bureau of Unemployment Compensation in Ohio

from 1946-1947; Justice of the Peace for Elyria Township in Huron County from 1947-1952; President of the Elyria City Council from 1956-1957; Elyria City Solicitor from 1958-1959; Lorain County Commissioner from 1961-1966; Clerk of Council from 1967-1970. He was appointed Municipal Judge of Elyria in 1972, where he served until his retirement in 1985.

JIM and LOUISE attended the Lake Avenue United Church of Christ in Elyria, Ohio, where they made their home. After their retirement they spent their winters in Fort Myers, Florida, until LOUISE passed away in

October 1991, after 53 years of marriage.

JIM was one of the group that participated in the "COUSINS 2ND TRIP TO EUROPE" in September/October 1993, when they visited the ancestral Village of Kaltenholzhausen; toured the Pergammon Museum in Berlin; San Souchi Palace in Potsdam; Thomas Church in Leipzig; Rothenburg; Passion Play site in Oberammergau; King Ludwig II of Bavaria's world famous Neuschwanstein Castle; and attended Oktoberfest in Munich - before heading to Austria where they rode the Cable Car to the top of the Nordketten Alp while in Innsbruck; toured the "Sound of Music" sites around Salzburg; and the Schonbrunn Palace while in Vienna.

ANNELORE HEYMANN ALTENHOFEN of Arzbach, Germany near Koblenz was the third daughter and youngest of six children born to PHILIPPINE PFEIFFER and AUGUST HEYMANN of Kaltenholzhausen, Germany. He was an architect, District Fireman and leader of the Volunteer Fire Brigade in Bad Schwalbach, and served in the military from 1914-1918.

ANNELORE was a former children's nurse, and was married in the Kaltenholzhausen Protestant Church of Germany to RUDOLF ALTENHOFEN, known as RUDI, a Supervisor of Forestry in the Oak Forest at Bad Ems, Germany and State Rhineland-Palatinate prior to his 1985 retirement. He was the son of ELISABETHE FUNK and KARL ALTENHOFEN.

ANNELORE and RUDI are the parents of two married daughters: HEIDEMARIE ALTENHOFEN and MANFRED NAX of Worms-Pfeddersheim, Germany - who are the parents of 3 boys: DAVID NAX, age 16, and twin sons MICHAEL and MORITZ NAX, age 14 years; and MARGIT ALTENHOFEN and JURGEN KRAMER of Bad Ems. ANNELORE and RUDI celebrated their 45th Wedding Anniversary on April 16, 1994.

ANNELORE and RUDI were our hosts during our "COUSINS 1ST TRIP TO GERMANY" in May 1989, along with HILDE and WILLI SCHAFER and HANNELORE and THORWALD STARK of Kaltenholzhausen, and ELLEN and RUDOLF WAGNER of Dauborn. They made all of us feel so welcome and really special. These four couples were again our hosts for our two day celebration in the Ancestral Village of Kaltenholzhausen during our "COUSINS 2ND TRIP TO EUROPE" in September 1994 ... with an incredible and wonderful time!

Since our first trip to Germany in 1989 - ANNELORE and RUDI have honored us with 3 visits to the USA - in May 1990, in April/May 1992 and once again in October 1994, accompanied by their grandson DAVID NAX. We hope they will cross the Atlantic many, many more times in the future.

REV. LLOYD HENRY LINDER of Fremont, Ohio (page 65) was the tenth child and eighth son of STELLA PAULINE SCHEID and FREDERICK WILLIAM LINDER. He attended Stamm Grade School in Fremont and was graduated in 1943 from Fremont Ross High School.
