Dear Cousins,

As we again approach this Thanksgiving season, it is time to reflect on all our many blessings this past year. So much has been accomplished over the past few years, we all have much to be thankful for - as well as both proud and pleased. With your help the former HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH, now the site of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, stands beautiful and tall with its new white steeple and cross ... like a crowning jewel in the midst of our new NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT.

HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS:

The new Roof, Gutters and Downspouts were completed in August 1987 - with the erection of a new Sign in 1988. This was followed by installation of Storm Windows over both south Leaded Glass Windows on the CHURCH, and precautionary termite control application.

In 1989 the original Pulpit was restored, courtesy of Board Member DONALD R. HEYMAN and brother MARION O. HEYMAN, both of Liberty Center, Ohio - as well as a new Picket Fence around the property. In May 1990 JOHN P. SEAMAN, Sr., Monroeville, Ohio gave the Fence its first coat of paint - followed in June 1991 by a second coat of paint, administered by JOHN, PEARL SCHWOCHOW, Clyde, Ohio and MAURICE HEYMAN, Worthington, Ohio. In October 1991 the job was completed by JOHN, and CLEO HEYMAN, Napoleon, Ohio - followed in 1992 by the CHURCH itself receiving a much needed fresh coat of paint, eight years after the last sprucing up in 1983.

In October 1989, under the auspices of our Honorary Senior Counsel, JOSEPH S. HEYMAN of Perrysburg, Ohio, a Grant was obtained from the FRANCE STONE FOUNDATION in the amount of \$10,000. - with the hope that it could be matched by the Cousins, under the Matching Funds Endowment Plan. It was stipulated that only the interest of these funds could be used for the continued maintenance of the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH over the years. Through your most generous contributions this goal was accomplished!

New wiring was installed in 1990 so that lights, and the new Church Organ donated by Board Member RICHARD P. REECE of Berlin Heights, Ohio, could be used, and available for all functions throughout the year. This also enabled us to start our Christmas lighting program for your pleasure. With the aid of a timer, you may drive by the CHURCH and see the beautiful decorations each evening in December from 7:00 - 10:00 P.M.

In August 1991 two portraits from 1858 of KATHERINE SCHEID and JOHN HENRY HEYMANN, parents of 15 children, were given by their granddaughter HENRIETTA HEYMAN of Petaluma, California and her siblings, after being restored by HOPE KUSHMAUL, Pittsford, Michigan. Then in August 1993 a portrait from 1893 of VERENA BALLMER and WILLIAM FREDERICK HEYMANN and their 12 children, was donated by their granddaughter DORIS GERALDINE HEYMAN HIGHTREE and DORIS CAROL HIGHTREE BINACO of Anaheim, California.

In July 1993 the new Foundation and Basement Project was completed - with much teamwork and hard work by Chairman, CHASE B. HEYMAN, Norwalk, Ohio, ROBERT W. SMITH and JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR., both of Monroeville, Ohio and other Board Members of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY.

In October 1993 confirmation was received from the NATIONAL PARK SERVICE, DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, that the intersection of STATE ROUTE #547 and SANDHILL ROAD - known as HUNT'S CORNERS - had been entered into the NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES - and was now part of a NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT - a project that had been in the works since 1984 - and a very welcome notification.

In September 1994 a beautiful handmade wall hanging Grandfather's Clock was given by BARBARA WEIDMAN and RAY CLEMENTS of Columbus, Indiana, in thanks for participating in both the May 1989 and September/October

1993 "Cousins Trips To Europe".

Also in September 1994, another expensive project was completed - at a cost of over \$22,000. - the erection of the historically correct octagonal CHURCH Steeple with cedar siding. The white Cross on top is courtesy of Board Member ELDEN PLUE of Livonia, Michigan, in memory of

his grandfather SAMUEL HEYMAN.

During 1995 the white Picket Fence was scraped and repainted again, after many long weeks of laborious hours spent by JOAN and HAROLD ZORN of Sandusky, Ohio. In August the new Park Benches were assembled by HAROLD, LOUIS ZORN, Sandusky, and ROBERT NASBY, Hobart, Indiana. The grass was kept well mowed with the assistance to JOHN SEAMAN this year by son-in-law ROD DOWNING of Bellevue, Ohio, and Board Member PEARL SCHWOCHOW and husband NORM of Clyde, Ohio helped keep the Flower Beds etc. well tended.

Our thanks to all that have helped contribute over the years in making the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH, MEMORIAL ARBORETUM and CHURCH Property looking so beautiful ... both inside and out ... for the rest of us.

HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY SIGN REPAINTED:

If you visited or drove past the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH, you may have wondered where our HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY Sign had disappeared for a few months. It was getting restored and repainted - and was replaced on Saturday, August 5, 1995 by Board Member LOUIS ZORN and his brother HAROLD ZORN, both of Sandusky, Ohio and ROBERT NASBY, Hobart, Indiana.

The sign had been erected in August 1988, and after seven years of weather needed a new coat of paint. The most welcome sign had been given in memory of HAROLD WAYNE HEYMAN, and donated by his wife, SADIE ANN LAWLER HEYMAN (who passed away in 1991), and their three daughters and husbands, MARJORIE HEYMAN & GEORGE BERKICH of Del Mar, California; BERNEITA HEYMAN & RICHARD DEVOS, Cleveland, Ohio and ILLENE HEYMAN & RICHARD LUTHANEN, Readstown, Wisconsin. The sign was replaced just in time for the Annual JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN REUNION - held the 1ST SUNDAY IN AUGUST - where ALL Cousins are most welcome each year.

NEW CHURCH STEEPLE:

All must agree that today the former HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH, now the site of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, looks beautiful and complete with its newly erected white Steeple.

We are happy to report that JOSEPH S. HEYMAN was again able to secure an additional \$5,000. Grant from the FRANCE STONE FOUNDATION, and with pledges by the Board of Directors of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY to match that amount with their own \$5,000. - plus the many generous contributions and memorials for loved ones this past year from all of you Cousins - we have now raised \$17,659.54 in our Fund Drive for the \$22,000. cost of our new Steeple. It should be noted, that at this time last year - only \$5,800. had been collected - so a big 'Pat On The Back' goes to all our contributors! Now only \$4,340.46 of our goal of \$22,000. remains to be met. Thank you so much. It was deeply appreciated ... and we could not have done it without your help. A white Picket Fence surrounds the CHURCH property - with our large sign out front.

UPCOMING CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS:

With completion of the new CHURCH Steeple - our list of improvements gets smaller each year. Some of the items next on the agenda ... as funds become available ... include:

- 1. Restoration of all beautiful Leaded Glass Windows in the CHURCH.
- 2. Repair of the CHURCH Chimney.
- Shutters on all the windows as shown in earlier photos of the CHURCH - in keeping with staying as historically accurate as possible in our restoration work.
- 4. New Brick Sidewalk on CHURCH Property.
- 5. New Evergreens or Shrubs around the new Foundation of the CHURCH.
- Restoration Funds for the HUNT'S CORNERS CEMETERY Straighten Monuments - and Wrought Iron Fence with name of the CEMETERY.
- 7. New Signs for the NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT of HUNT'S CORNERS.
- 8. Another Coat of White Paint on the outside of the CHURCH due in the Spring of 1997 - just in time for our 150TH ANNIVERSARY of the arrival of PHILIP WILLIAM HEYMANN - the first HEYMANN to set foot in America in 1847. More about that later.

MEMORIAL ARBORETUM IMPROVEMENTS:

This year we were pleased to add the second and third Commemorative Park Benches in our MEMORIAL ARBORETUM located on the CHURCH property. One was given in Loving Memory of CECILE MARY SMITH, by her husband HERALD HEYMAN SMITH of El Paso, Texas - and the matching and third one - in Honor of HERALD HEYMAN SMITH (Page 292), the son of HAZEL A. HEYMAN and FRANK SMITH, descendants of the WILLIAM CONRAD HEYMANN Line. HERALD had previously contributed a Commemorative Park Post Light in CECILE's Memory - and now the matching Park Benches sit next to that Post Light. A Dedication Ceremony was held Sunday, August 6, 1995 conducted by REV. LLOYD H. LINDER ... and attended by approximately 150 Cousins.

Our first Commemorative Park Bench was donated in Honor of JUDGE HARVEY E. HYMAN of Paulding, Ohio (Page 320), by his son DAVID HYMAN and wife JACKIE and their children. The first Commemorative Park Post Light was given in Honor of DAVID A. HYMAN by his wife JACKIE and children: RACHEL, ERIN, GRETCHEN, HARVEY D. and JAMES HYMAN also of Paulding, Ohio.

Our five Colorado Blue Spruce Trees continue to grow and frame the northwest corner of our MEMORIAL ARBORETUM. The middle one was given in May 1990 by the JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN REUNION (Pages 15-159) in Memory of PHILIP WILLIAM HEYMANN - our own "CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS" - to commemorate his arrival in America in 1847.

The other four Evergreen Trees and Plaques were given and dedicated in May 1990 in honor of the first visit from Germany of our Cousins ANNELORE & RUDI ALTENHOFEN of Arzbach; HILDE & WILLI SCHAFER and HANNELORE & THORWALD STARK, all of Kaltenholzhausen; and ELLEN & RUDOLF WAGNER of Dauborn, Board Member of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY - and our Continental Affairs Chairman.

A Flowering Crab Apple Tree and Plaque were donated in 1990 on the occasion of the 50th Golden Wedding Anniversary of VIOLET & MELVIN HERNER of Bellevue, Ohio by their three daughters and their husbands: RITA HERNER & THOMAS BOALS of Boise, Idaho; NANCY HERNER & FRANK OSBORN of Bellevue, Ohio; and BONNIE HERNER & DR. DUANE PETERSON of Erie, Michigan.

A sturdy Oak Tree and Plaque were dedicated in August 1992 by the JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN REUNION (Pages 18-159) to Commemorate the Anniversary of his 195th Birthday. Also in August 1992 the grandchildren of PHILIP AUGUST ZISS (Pages 18-23) dedicated a Norway Maple tree in his Memory.

Board Member PEARL JOYCE HEYMAN SCHWOCHOW of Clyde, Ohio and her sister JOYCE ANITA HEYMAN CANN of Sandusky, Ohio gave a Tree and Plaque in Memory of their parents, EMMA DOERNER and JACOB PAUL HEYMAN. Then in October 1993 PEARL and her husband NORMAN SCHWOCHOW donated a round Tulip Bed in honor of their 50th Golden Wedding Anniversary - and in 1994 contributed a Sun Dial for the center of it, with a Plaque reading: "IN CELEBRATION OF THE HEYMANN COUSINS 2ND TRIP TO GERMANY" in September and

October 1993. JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR., later plants the bed with Marigolds, which are enjoyed by all during the Summer and Fall months.

The late LAVERNE S. HEYMAN donated a large Plaque for the CHURCH, where names continue to be added, of those that have contributed to the

MEMORIAL ARBORETUM over the years.

Our thanks to all those who have added to the beauty of the CHURCH and the MEMORIAL ARBORETUM over the past few years, thus providing enjoyment for all the Cousins ... and any others that pass our way.

PROFILE OF A BOARD MEMBER:

MAURICE LAMAR HEYMAN of Worthington, Ohio (Page 159) is the second child and second son of ALMA ROSE SPRAU and CALVIN CARL HEYMAN. He received his education in the LYME TOWNSHIP ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, was graduated in 1936 from MONROEVILLE HIGH SCHOOL in Monroeville, Ohio, and in 1939 graduated from TIFFIN UNIVERSITY in Tiffin, Ohio, where he majored in Business Administration.

He was employed at NATIONAL REFINING COMPANY in Cleveland, Ohio from 1939-1941, when he enlisted in the U.S. NAVAL RESERVES, and served four years in the U.S. and Pacific area. In 1947 he started work at STANDARD OIL COMPANY OF OHIO, where he remained until his retirement in 1981 after 34 years of service. He was a Field Audit Supervisor in the Northern Kentucky area; Northwest West Virginia; and Southwest Ohio - including

As a continuing feature of your NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER ... we are profiling three Cousins ... we think you should know a little better.

She received her education in the Kipton and Elyria, Ohio public schools and was graduated from SUPERIOR CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL in Superior, Wisconsin. She was employed in the office accounting department of ARMOUR & CO., later bought out by GREYHOUND, until her retirement in 1976 after almost 40 years of service.

IREME is married to EDWARD PATRICK O'ROURKE who worked for the STATE OF MINNESOTA in the Livestock Weighing Department until his retirement in 1980 after 35 years of service. Excitement mounts as we look forward to again visiting with ELLEN & RUDOLF WAGNER, Board Member of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, in their home at Dauborn - and later in the home of ANNELORE & RUDI ALTENHOFEN at Arzbach. The trip would not be complete of course without a visit to our "roots", where we will attend Church in our ancestral Village of Kaltenholzhausen, and renew our friendship with Cousins HILDE & WILLI SCHAFER and son ERHARD SCHAFER, and HANNELORE & THORWALD STARK. Another highlight will be dinner served in the CASTLE AT BURGSCHWALBACH - built by HEYMANNS over 650 years ago! Imagine your own Family Castle! The HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY Board Members will also be holding their second meeting in the Castle during their stay.
