ANNUAL NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER - 1996

Dear Cousins,

As we enter this Thanksgiving season, it is time to look back and recount our many blessings over the past year. What an exciting time it has been! The HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH continues to shine - like a star in all it's glory - in the NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT - especially with the beautiful white cross - a gift from Board Member ELDEN H. PLUE of Livonia, Michigan - perched atop the octagon shaped white steeple erected in September 1994. Now work has also started on restoring each of the beautiful eight leaded glass windows in the CHURCH. This will be followed by the addition of new green shutters for all the windows - in keeping with restoring the CHURCH to its original state.

The CHURCH chimney is being repaired, and new steps with a wooden hand railing leading up to the Choir Loft have been built and installed by STANG BUILDERS. The CHURCH was again decorated for Christmas with two large evergreen wreaths and large red bows, spot-lighted on the white double doors. Evergreen garlands and red bows graced the white picket fence, with small white lights woven along the top, which were lit each night during December from 7:00 to 10:00 P.M.

The picket fence was erected in September 1989 by Board Member DONALD R. HEYMAN and his brother MARION O. HEYMAN, both of Liberty Center, Ohio. They were joined by crew members DANIEL HEYMAN, MATTHEW HEYMAN, JOSHUA HEYMAN, JOSEPH HEYMAN and WILBUR CONRAD all of Grand Rapids, Ohio; KENNETH DAVIS, Monclova, Ohio; President, JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR. of Monroeville, Ohio; Treasurer, MAURICE L. HEYMAN, Worthington, Ohio; Board Members WILLIAM F. HEIMAN of Tontogany, Ohio; RICHARD P. REECE, Berlin Heights, Ohio; and ROBERT W. SMITH - plus BRADLEY C. SMITH and JACK STRONG all of Monroeville. In July 1996 JOAN & HAROLD ZORN of Sandusky, Ohio continued their second summer of scraping and repainting the white picket fence, making it continue to look bright and clean.

Inside the CHURCH a magnificent new Coat of Arms Tapestry Banner was unveiled during Reunion CHURCH services in August 1996. The beautiful Tapestry Banner is approximately 50" wide and 60" long, and looks very regal with it's vivid blue and red colors on the motifs of the shield, helmet, fleur de lis, and the hayman with the scythe, all outlined in black. The side panels include Kansas wheat woven from wheat straw, and also depicts Rhine River grapes, with fringe and tassels added on the lower edges. Our heartfelt thanks go to SANDRA & JOHN C. HEYMAN of Burns, Kansas for their most wonderful gift. It is very elegant and represents a year's worth of hard work by SANDY. The Cousins at the Reunion CHURCH service were simply awestruck by it's beauty ... and many more will be able to enjoy it in the years ahead. Just incredible!

Our thanks to all the Cousins for their fine efforts and kindness. We have truly been blessed with so many caring and wonderful relatives.

In May 1996 our "COUSINS 3RD TRIP TO EUROPE" found our group joining our Cousins in Germany for another wonderful and exciting gathering at the lovely Dauborn home of ELLEN and Board Member RUDOLF WAGNER for the most fantastic pastries! Then we were treated to a delicious dinner served in the new cabin in the woods of ANNELORE & RUDI ALTENHOFEN, a former Forestry Supervisor, of Arzbach, Germany ... with a Brass Hunting Horn group that played outside for our entertainment.

On Sunday we were privileged to attend Church once again with all our Cousins in our ancestral Village of Kaltenholzhausen - which was conducted in both English and German - and very well done- and sang some favorite hymns - also in English and German. Their 20 member choir is superb! and included ANNELORE'S niece BRIGITTE SPRENGER KITSCHKE and

SIEGRID ZIMMERMANN, the wife of former MAYOR REINHOLD ZIMMERMANN.

A group photo was taken on the steps of the KALTENHOLZHAUSEN CHURCH, before we headed for the Town Square to see how our beautiful "FRIENDSHIP TREE" has grown since our visit in 1993! - 5. Another Coat of White Paint on the outside of the CHURCH.
- 6. A new Coat of Paint for the inside of the CHURCH.

"COUSINS 3RD TRIP TO EUROPE":

On Tuesday, May 14, 1996 we gathered all afternoon - from nine states and Canada - in our AMERICAN AIRLINES V.I.P. ROOM at O'HARE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT in Chicago for our 6:00 P.M. non-stop flight to Milan, Italy and the start of our tailor-made 15 day odyssey to Italy, Switzerland, a touch of France and Austria, and of course Germany.
