The HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY has been blessed with continued support from all of you, for all the many on-going worthwhile projects involving the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH, and keeping it in excellent condition both inside and out. With the family ties that give our days a warm feeling ... we find we have many things to be thankful for this year.

CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS:

In October 1997 the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH received two fresh coats of white paint, to make it sparkling clean in anticipation of the Big 150TH CELEBRATION, and the visit of our Cousins from Germany to join us during our SUNDAY, AUGUST 2, 1998 JOINT REUNION for the entire family. We can hardly wait!!!

All eight of the original Stained Glass Windows in the CHURCH are being restored - one by one - and four windows have now been completed.

New Green Shutters for all the CHURCH windows are also being installed - in keeping with restoring the CHURCH to its original state - now located in a NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT.

A new HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY sign in front of the CHURCH will be erected soon to also greet us in the coming year. We are sure our ancestors would be most pleased with the results of all these efforts made possible by each one of you - with your continued support.

MEMORIAL ARBORETUM:

Our thanks to Board Member and Chairwoman of the Landscape Committee PEARL HEYMAN & NORMAN SCHWOCHOW of Clyde, Ohio and ANNE MARIE & JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR. of Monroeville, Ohio for trimming all the evergreens around the CHURCH, and adding the floral plantings at the entrance of the CHURCH. In the center of the MEMORIAL ARBORETUM the large round Tulip Bed with the Sun Dial was enjoyed throughout the Spring - and then beautiful Impatiens were planted in the flower bed for the pleasure of all during the Summer months. They were huge ... and gorgeous!

Credit and thanks also go to ROD DOWNING of Monroeville and WILLIAM SEAMAN of Detroit, Michigan, for assisting JOHN with mowing the grass around the CHURCH property and the HUNT'S CORNERS area this past year.

Two additional Commemorative Trees have been planted in the MEMORIAL ARBORETUM, and will be dedicated on Sunday, August 2, 1998, right after morning services in the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH. PROFILE OF A BOARD MEMBER:

As we continue our year-long 150TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION of the coming of the First HEYMANNS to America in 1847 and 1848, it is only fitting we tell you a little about the current president of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY ... JOHN PHILIP SEAMAN, SR. of Monroeville, Ohio (Page 419). He was the only child and son of MABEL BELLE HEYMAN and WALTER CRENKE SEAMAN, and was born at Lakewood, Ohio in Cuyahoga County. He received his education in the Lakewood public schools and graduated with honors in Social Studies from WESTERN RESERVE ACADEMY, where he was a lettered varsity soccer player, served as an assistant to the Librarian and participated in various musical groups. He studied Political Science, History and was admitted to the Honors program in Economics while attending WILLIAMS COLLEGE in Williamstown, Massachusetts, where he was a member of Zeta Psi Fraternity and lettered in soccer.

He served in the U.S. NAVY at Great Lakes, Illinois, WRIGHT JUNIOR COLLEGE, TEXAS A & M COLLEGE and WARD ISLAND at Corpus Christi, Texas in aircraft theory and maintenance. He was later assigned to the Naval Air Material Center in the Naval Yard at Philadelphia, where he was involved in research and development of radar housings for naval aircraft, prior

to his discharge in 1946 at Bainbridge, Maryland.

JOHN is the father of seven children: JOHN PHILIP SEAMAN, JR., Monroeville, Ohio; ANN ELIZABETH SEAMAN KEAN, Cincinnati, Ohio; CATHARINE LOUISE SEAMAN DOWNING, Bellevue, Ohio; WILLIAM CRAIG SEAMAN, Detroit, Michigan; JULIA BEDELL SEAMAN, Cleveland, Ohio; CAROLYN SEAMAN SCHAEFFER, Milan, Ohio and DAVID NATHANIEL SEAMAN of Chicago, Illinois. In July 1997 JOHN was married in the former HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH to ANNE MARIE RODERICK of Norwalk, Ohio, and they make their home in Monroeville, Ohio.

JOHN was engaged in farming and established GRAIN MERCHANTS INC., a specialty producer of wild bird seed and other aviary feeds. He also became manager of an agribusiness enterprise, SEAMAN MCLEAN GRAIN ELEVATOR INC., and represented NEW YORK LIFE and TRAVELERS INSURANCE as a

Life and Health Insurance agent for over 20 years.

JOHN is again engaged in farming on his OXFORD FARMS with his eldest son JOHN JR., and in May 1989 completed the restoration and opened HEYMANN HOUSE BED & BREAKFAST in the former home of his grandparents, LIBBIE HARTMAN and LOUIS PHILIP HEYMAN. He is a past officer and member of the Milan, Ohio Rotary Club, past president of the Firelands Council of Historical Societies, Ohio Association of Historical Societies & Museums, chairman of the Village Green Art Show in Milan, Ohio and a member of the Free & Accepted Masons since 1950.

MEET SOME OF YOUR COUSINS:

As a continuing feature of your NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER ... we are profiling three Cousins ... we think you should know a little better.

GARY LEE CLELAND of Swanton, Ohio (Page 364), the first of two sons of IRENE MILDRED NORMANDO and LAWRENCE CLELAND, was born in Los Angeles, California in Los Angeles County. He received his education in the Norwalk, Ohio schools and served in the U.S. NAVY from 1958 to 1962.

In 1966 GARY was married to THERESA ANN WORLINE, a high school teacher and the daughter of MARY ELLEN and ARLO WORLINE of Swanton. GARY and THERESA are the parents of three children: CHAD DAVID CLELAND,

MATTHEW JOHN CLELAND and ANGELA SUE CLELAND. In 1996 GARY and THERESA

celebrated their 30th Pearl Wedding Anniversary.

After his discharge from the Navy, GARY moved to Swanton, where he became an airplane mechanic for CROW INC. at the TOLEDO EXPRESS AIRPORT. In 1967 he decided to turn his hobby of guns, shooting and hunting into a part-time business of gunsmithing and started selling guns and hunting equipment out of their garage. By 1971 GARY had quit his mechanics job to devote full-time to his business, where they also sold archery, fishing equipment, outdoor clothing and other sporting goods.

Both sons assisted in the business over the years. Their eldest son Chad excels as a competitive rifleman, and spent three years with the U.S. ARMY Shooting Team as a Distinguished High Master Class Rifleman, and was the 1996 NRA National Muzzleloading Rifle Champion. THERESA was Ohio State Lady's Combat Pistol Champion in 1986, and manages their newly expanded 7,500 square foot facility called CLELAND'S OUTDOOR WORLD - located on Airport Highway in Swanton, Ohio - next door to the OHIO STATE POLICE Post.

DOLORES ELAINE BOBEL MOURDOCK of Marietta, Georgia (Page 702), the second child and only daughter of LYDIA AUGUSTA WEIMAR and CHARLES CONRAD BOBEL, was born in Haskins, Ohio in Wood County. She received her education in Haskins and at STAUTZENBERGER BUSINESS SCHOOL in Toledo. She served in the WAVES during World War II from 1944 to 1946 as a Yeoman 1st Class and was stationed in Washington, D.C. in the Mine Warfare

Section of the Office of Chief of Naval Operations.

In 1948 she was married in Haskins to DAVID LEE MOURDOCK, the son of HELEN DONELDA COBB and CLYDE EVERETT MOURDOCK. DOLORES and DAVID are the parents of two sons. Their first son, LARRY ALAN MOURDOCK, is married to MARSHA KAY BEACH and they make their home in Roswell, Georgia with their seven children - six girls and one boy - AMBER LYNN, AMANDA LEE, AMY LENORE, ADAM LUCAS, ABBY LEANN, AUTUMN LEA and ALYCE LARE MOURDOCK. Their second son, RICHARD EARL MOURDOCK, is married to MARILYN O'BRIEN and they reside in Evansville, Indiana. In February 1998 DOLORES and DAVID will be celebrating their 50th Golden Wedding Anniversary.

DOLORES was a secretary in the Ohio Public Schools in Delta, West Unity and Bucyrus. She later became a secretary in the Office Of Financial Aid at BOWLING GREEN STATE UNIVERSITY in Bowling Green, Ohio until her retirement in 1985, when they moved to Rotonda West, Florida. In 1996 they moved to Marietta, Georgia to be near their son Larry and

their seven grandchildren.

Animal Science from OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY, and was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in the U.S. ARMY. In 1975 he earned his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine from OHIO STATE, and following veterinary school, he entered active duty in the Army Veterinary Corps from 1975 to 1978, as a Captain serving at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio, Texas, at Fort Sill, Oklahoma and also in Pusan, Korea.

DUSTY moved to Cleveland in 1978, where he was employed as a staff veterinarian by the CLEVELAND WEST SIDE EMERGENCY GROUP INC., who operated an emergency animal clinic. On his days off from the EMERGENCY CLINIC, he did relief work for a private veterinary practice. From 1978 to 1982 he was a member of the ARMY RESERVE, specializing in the

emergency care of pets.

In 1980 he moved to the farm on State Route 113, where his father Gerald was born, and raised Rangerbred Appaloosa horses, and began extensive remodeling of the farm. Today DUSTY continues running the farm in Amherst, Ohio with hogs, grain and horses, and is a member of the Amherst Fraternal Order of Eagles.
