# MEET SOME OF YOUR COUSINS:

As a continuing feature of your NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER ... we are profiling three Cousins ... we think you should know a little better.

FRANK ALBERT HEYMAN of Burns, Kansas (Page 412), the second child and second son of HATTIE HERZIG and JOHN CALVIN HEYMANN, was born at Burns, Kansas in Butler County, and received his education in the DeGRAFF, KANSAS PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

FRANK was married in Kingman, Kansas to FAYE PAULINE SCHRADER, the daughter of MADGE MAY SNYDER and JOHN SCHRADER. FRANK and FAYE are the parents of one son, JOHN CALVIN HEYMAN II, also of Burns. They have one grandson, JAMES FRANK HEYMAN of Wichita, Kansas, and one great grandson, STEVEN CHRISTOPHER HEYMAN.

FRANK was a stockman engaged in farming, and served as the Lincoln Township Trustee, was Trustee of the BURNS RURAL FIRE DEPARTMENT, was a member of the MASONIC LODGE at Florence, Kansas, and the SCOTTISH RITE of FREE MASONRY in Wichita, the WICHITA CONSISTORY, the KANSAS LIVESTOCK ASSOCIATION, and is an accomplished gunsmith.

FRANK enjoys restoring steam engines, old tractors, cars, trucks, repairing old guns, and making gun stocks in his spare time. FRANK was featured in an article in the "GRASS & GRAIN" Newspaper on October 27, 1998, and also in the November/December 1998 Tractor Collector's Magazine "ANTIQUE POWER". In the five page spread with photos, FRANK said he always had an interest in RUMELY tractors, because his Dad farmed, threshed and did some custom work using older Rumelys, which were made in LaPorte, Indiana.

FRANK says the RUMELYS were called "King of the Lightweights" and he believes they were. He said the Model H was introduced in 1919 to replace RUMELY'S first small tractor, and was built until 1924, when RUMELY introduced Lightweight OILPULLS. It was one of the last big tractors built - and soon disappeared after ALLIS-CHALMERS took over RUMELYS in 1931. His favorite RUMELY was the 30-60 OILPULL, which FRANK claims was without a doubt one of the most awesome of the prairie giants. He also stated it was hard to ever wear out a good RUMELY. In addition to the Rumelys, he also liked to use AULTMAN-TAYLORS and AVERY tractors.

On October 24, 1998 FRANK held a huge sale and one of his RUMELY tractors was one of several items auctioned off. Many Heymann cousins were among those attending the sale, and several cousins had a Heymann Family Reunion the day of the sale. FRANK and FAYE both share an interest in antiques, and attend the METHODIST CHURCH in Burns, Kansas where they make their home. In April 1999 FRANK and FAYE celebrated their 65th Wedding Anniversary.

#### NEW FRIENDSHIP HALL:

For the past several years the JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN REUNION has been renting tents (paid for by JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR.) for each of their annual gatherings. Knowing our upcoming 150TH ANNIVERSARY celebration would be bringing in many more Cousins from across the United States than usual plus a visit by several of our Cousins from Germany to participate in this historic event - the Trustees of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY voted to erect a shelter, to accommodate the large gathering in case of bad weather - or to protect all the Cousins from the hot August sun - both then and for future Reunions.
