Dear Cousins,

With the harvest season and autumn upon us, we realize we have so much to be thankful for again during this past year. Thanksgiving will soon be here for all the Cousins, which is a wonderful family gathering time each year for most - and we will all be counting our many blessings, and looking forward to the coming year with great anticipation.

COUSINS 4TH TRIP TO EUROPE:

With the help of our Cousins in Germany - most of the plans have now been completed for our exciting "COUSINS 4TH TRIP TO EUROPE". We can hardly wait! About 70 Cousins will be gathering in our American Airlines VIP Room at O'Hare International Airport in Chicago on Thursday, May 31, 2001 for the first leg of our journey to ... London England! There we will see WINDSOR CASTLE, BUCKINGHAM PALACE, WESTMINSTER ABBEY etc.

After a couple of days in London, we will be going aboard the new "Eurostar" Train for our "Chunnel" experience, and a visit to Paris, France! While there for a couple of days we will also have our usual Group Photo taken - with all of us wearing our matching HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY COAT OF ARMS clothing. While in Paris of course we will be taking a trip down the CHAMPS ELYSEES, seeing the EIFFEL TOWER, NOTRE DAME, the LOUVRE, VERSAILLES et al. Following dinner one night we will also be taking a memorable drive along the floodlit boulevards, and then enjoying a Seine River Cruise ... to see Paris after dark.

Next up will be a visit to Belgium - where we will have a tour of the GRAND PLACE in Brussels, and also visit the medieval City of Brugge. Then on to the land of canals and windmills - for a couple of days in Amsterdam. Included there will be a canal cruise, to show us the 16th century homes of Holland's Golden Age, followed by a typical Dutch meal in a rural setting.

While in Luxembourg, after viewing the 10th century CITADEL, and visiting the grave of General George Patton, we will be going to the home of Cousins MARYSE and JURGEN HEIMANN and their two sons, ROMAIN, age 13, and ADRIAN, age 9 years, who have graciously invited all of us for coffee/tea in their home.

Next we drive into Germany to visit Trier - the oldest city of Germany and then ... comes the icing on the cake ... as we are greeted by ELLEN and RUDOLF WAGNER of Dauborn, our International Board Member of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, ANNELORE and RUDI ALTENHOFEN of Arzbach, HILDE and WILLY SCHAFER, former Mayor of our ancestral Village of Kaltenholzhausen, their son ERHARD and ANETTE SCHAFER of Marburg, with HANNELORE and THORWALD STARK of Kaltenholzhausen. They will be joined by

some of the 29 Cousins that traveled to America in 1998, to celebrate our 150th Anniversary. Together we will all attend church in our ancestral Village of Kaltenholzhausen on Sunday, followed by lunch together with all the Cousins. To finish off the day some will be climbing the Tower of the CASTLE at BURGSCHWALBACH, where we will be having our "Rittersaal" Dinner that evening, in the Castle built by Heymanns over 650 years ago.

On Monday, following a tour of the COLOGNE CATHEDRAL, and having lunch on the Square, we will be taking a Rhine River Cruise from Boppart to St. Goar, before having our Farewell Dinner in our hotel - and saying Auf Wiedersehen to Germany again - then heading back to America on Tuesday, June 12, 2001. Our deepest thanks to all the Cousins ahead of time ... for again helping make this trip so enjoyable and memorable, with all your meetings and help over the past few months. We will all be looking forward to our visit with all of you so much!!!

EXTRA PLANE SEATS:

When the first deposits started coming in so rapidly - we soon realized that unless we disappointed an awful lot of people - we were going to HAVE to add a second bus for this trip. Therefore instead of securing one of Europe's oversized buses that held 52 people on our last trip - we have obtained two regular deluxe coaches that hold 40-44 persons. With approximately 35 on each bus, there will be lots of room.

The AMERICAN AIRLINES flight is a different matter though. When their tickets are gone - any late joiners would have to catch an earlier flight - and then wait for the rest of us in London.

To remedy that - we have already reserved several extra seats on our plane for any additional Cousins that would still like to join us. We want as many as possible to be together with us on our most exciting trip to London ... and beyond. We have all started counting the days until our departure ... as it promises to be our best trip ever!

With tiny white lights and evergreen garlands and red bows added the white picket fence surrounding the Church property looked elegant
during the 1999 Christmas season. More white lights were added to the
evergreen shrubs in front of the Church and also trees in the MEMORIAL
ARBORETUM. With spotlights on the front doors - and lights turned on
inside and out - the newly restored beautiful Stained Glass Windows
looked extra colorful all through that Christmas season.

YOUR HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH:

In case you have not yet had a chance to visit the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH - we encourage you to do so. Each year we give directions so that new visitors will always be able to find it. The CHURCH is located at 4550 ON ROUTE #547 - just SOUTH of U.S. Route #20 - down Sandhill Road - (EAST of Bellevue, Ohio - and WEST of Monroeville, Ohio). A white Picket Fence surrounds the CHURCH property - with our large sign out front. The Church is locked at all times, but a phone call to any of the local Board Members who have a key, will allow you to take a tour of the inside.

HUNT'S CORNERS CEMETERY RESTORATION:

Our thanks to DEAN A. JONES of Norwalk, Ohio for completing the work on repairing the footings of several monuments in the HUNT'S CORNERS CEMETERY. DEAN had been assisting Board Member ROBERT W. SMITH, the Chairman of the HUNT'S CORNERS CEMETERY RESTORATION Project, until his death in April 1997. Working alone since then, DEAN continued the restoration work on his own. Our thanks to him for his dedication and perseverance. The HUNT'S CORNERS CEMETERY is now in excellent condition.

We hope one day to have funds to erect a simple Black Wrought Iron Fence across the front of the Cemetery - including a Black Wrought Iron Sign with the name - HUNT'S CORNERS CEMETERY - so those in future generations will know the name of the cemetery - where many relatives have been laid to rest.

Some of you from out of town might like to visit the HUNT'S CORNERS CEMETERY at some time, but may not be quite sure where it is located. It is just around the corner - South - of the CHURCH and HEYMANN HOUSE BED & BREAKFAST - on the West side of Sandhill Road.

From time to time Cousins ask if there are projects they might fund in memory of a loved one. A new Black Wrought Iron Sign with the Cemetery's name - and/or funds for a new Black Wrought Iron Fence across the front of the Cemetery - would both make very worthwhile projects for any family members in the future.

- Additional improvements for the new FRIENDSHIP HALL including side walls, sinks and bathrooms.

PROFILE OF A BOARD MEMBER:

JOHN PHILIP SEAMAN, SR. of Monroeville, Ohio, (Page 105/419) the only child and son of MABEL BELLE HEYMAN and WALTER CRENKE SEAMAN, received his education in the Lakewood public schools, and graduated with honors from WESTERN RESERVE ACADEMY at Hudson, Ohio. He later attended the Honors program at WILLIAMS COLLEGE in Williamstown, Massachusetts, and served in the U.S. NAVY, where his duties involved research and development of radar housings for naval aircraft.

JOHN is the father of seven children: JOHN PHILIP SEAMAN, JR. of Monroeville, Ohio; ANN ELIZABETH SEAMAN KEAN of Cincinnati, Ohio; CATHARINE LOUISE SEAMAN DOWNING of Bellevue, Ohio; WILLIAM CRAIG SEAMAN, Board Member and Secretary of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, of Detroit, Michigan; JULIA BEDELL SEAMAN of Seattle, Washington; CAROLYN SEAMAN SCHAEFFER of Milan, Ohio and DAVID NATHANIEL SEAMAN of Chicago, Illinois.

JOHN and his wife ANNE MARIE make their home in Monroeville.

In his capacity as President of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, JOHN has been instrumental in getting so many of the various projects for the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY started, there are almost too many to relate. Securing the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH from being moved, or the wrecking ball, has to be one of the greatest achievements of course. Then over the years starting all the various fund raising needed to secure a new roof, gutters, downspouts, new foundation, basement, erection of the picket fence around the church property and helping paint it.

He then found people and secured bids from various qualified persons to erect a new sign in front of the CHURCH, paint the inside and outside of the CHURCH, erect a new steeple, new ladder to the steeple, someone to restore the original pulpit, restore all of the stained glass windows in the CHURCH, added and painted new green shutters on the CHURCH - in keeping with restoring it to its original state. JOHN also planted trees and bushes in the MEMORIAL ARBORETUM, installed Post Lights and Benches, planted flowers each year at the entrance of the CHURCH, trimmed the evergreens, mowed the grass each week, and at Christmas provided the garland that graced the steps and picket fence.

Through his efforts the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH was included in the HUNT'S CORNERS project to be named a NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT, and a sign was later erected at the corner of the CHURCH property to identify it as such. With the CHURCH then in excellent condition inside and out, and our 150th Anniversary approaching in 1998, JOHN purchased the land to the northwest of HUNT'S CORNERS - and donated it to the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, so that our new FRIENDSHIP HALL could be erected in time for our 150th celebration - and the arrival of Cousins from Germany. Prior to 1998 JOHN had donated a tent each year erected on the grounds of HEYMANN HOUSE BED & BREAKFAST and furnished the tables and chairs for the JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN REUNION held the first Sunday in August each year.

For the past 20 years JOHN has been a very dedicated, loyal and leading supporter as a member of the Board of Trustees of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, where he served as their President, but has now decided to step down. We thank him for all the many hours he has devoted to the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, and realize he has left some very big shoes to fill ... for those following behind in the years ahead. Again our deepest thanks JOHN for all your hard work.

MAURICE LAMAR HEYMAN of Worthington, Ohio (Page 159/616) is the second child and second son of ALMA ROSE SPRAU and CALVIN CARL HEYMAN. He received his education in the LYME TOWNSHIP ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, was graduated in 1936 from MONROEVILLE HIGH SCHOOL in Monroeville, Ohio, and in 1939 graduated from TIFFIN UNIVERSITY in Tiffin, Ohio, where he majored in Business Administration.

He was employed at NATIONAL REFINING COMPANY in Cleveland, Ohio from 1939-1941, when he enlisted in the U.S. NAVAL RESERVES, and served four years in the U.S. and Pacific area. In 1947 he started work at STANDARD OIL COMPANY OF OHIO, where he remained until his retirement in 1981, after 34 years of service. NEW FRIENDSHIP HALL:

For the past several years the JOHN GEORGE HEYMANN REUNION has been renting tents (paid for by JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR.) for each of their annual gatherings. Knowing our upcoming 150TH ANNIVERSARY celebration would be bringing in many more Cousins from across the United States than usual plus a visit by several of our Cousins from Germany to participate in this historic event - the Trustees of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY voted to erect a shelter, to accommodate the large gathering in case of bad weather - or to protect all the Cousins from the hot August sun - both then and for future Reunions.

With this in mind, we had asked Board Member DONALD R. HEYMAN and his sons at HEYMAN BROTHERS CONSTRUCTION in Grand Rapids, Ohio to please give us an estimate on a bare minimum new building. Since he had done such a nice job on the Picket Fence around the CHURCH property, and also participated in restoring the original pulpit in the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH, we knew the quality of his excellent work. In June 1998 an estimate was presented and approved by the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY Board to construct a 42 ft. x 70 ft. shelter area for this purpose.

None of this would have been possible - except for a gift of land in the northwest quadrant of HUNT'S CORNERS by ANNE MARIE & JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR. of Monroeville, Ohio - just west of the intersection of Route 547 & Sandhill Road, solely for this purpose.

Next JACKIE & DAVID HYMAN and Family of Paulding, Ohio volunteered to donate a large sum towards a concrete floor for this New FRIENDSHIP HALL. Construction was started and completed prior to the August 2, 1998 historic 150TH REUNION.

Since then additional landscaping has been done by CHASE B. HEYMAN of Norwalk, Ohio and JOHN P. SEAMAN, SR. of Monroeville. Several of you have inquired when the Friendship Hall will be enclosed. Further work to put sides on the building to enclose it - plus sinks and bathrooms - will only be completed as funds became available - which has always been the policy of the HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY. We are working on achieving this goal, with about 1/3 collected to date ... and look forward to the completion of the Friendship Hall project ... when the funds are all in place. The Cousins have all been most generous - and we thank you.

EBENEZER 100TH ANNIVERSARY:

On October 17, 1999 the EBENEZER UNITED METHODIST CHURCH in Burns, Kansas held it's Centennial Anniversary celebration with PASTOR STEVE HYSOM conducting the service, and BETTY JANE BULLOCK WARDLAW of El Dorado, Kansas as organist, dressed in her pioneer outfit and bonnet. A catered dinner in the BURNS COMMUNITY CENTER followed at Noon, and Anniversary Cake and Punch were served in the Church Yard.

In the Spring of 1888, several German and Swiss families settled in the area. The WEST GERMANY METHODIST CONFERENCE sent a minister from Newton, Kansas, who preached in different homes. After the PRAIRIE VIEW SCHOOL was built in 1894, part of the services were held there.

Then in 1898 Burns and Cassoday were united as a circuit. Within a year the present Church was built. PASTOR C. KOERNER was the builder, assisted by G. NOTZ and J. FREY. The pews and pulpit were made by REV. KOERNER, the land was given by GEORGE KNAUSS, the bell by the KNAUSSMANS, and the organ by the REV. JOHN JACOB SCHWARZ.

JOHN HENRY HEYMANN (1828-1914) was a Charter Member of the EBENEZER UNITED METHODIST CHURCH in rural Burns, Kansas, and is buried along with many of his descendants in the EBENEZER CEMETERY, right next door to the Church - including his 19th and last child, son PAUL HEYMANN (1889-1975).

The "Celebrate" Banner and Pastor's Stole hanging on the front wall of the EBENEZER UNITED METHODIST CHURCH, were made by SANDRA SUE HEATH HEYMAN of Burns, as gifts from the descendants of JOHN HENRY HEYMANN for the Church's 100th Anniversary Celebration.

The name EBENEZER was chosen based on the Bible (I Samuel 7-12). "Hitherto hath the Lord helped us." The EBENEZER UNITED METHODIST CHURCH was dedicated on May 7, 1899.

75 YEARS AGO - 1925:
