MID-1200s
TO 1800s

On August 2, 2015 the Heymann Historical Society held its Annual Meeting at Hunt's Corners, Ohio following the church service, John George Heymann Reunion, and potluck luncheon. The roll was called at approximately 2:00p.m. Board Members present were David Hyman, Duane Heyman, Kurt Heyman, William Seaman, Neil Horn, Beth Horvatic, Rachel Parrett, Scott Bailey, and Ed Rose. Board members not in attendance included Lou Zorn, Matt Heyman and Ulrike Gapp.

The Minutes of the August 3, 2014 meeting were read by William Seaman. Correction was made as to the deconstruction of the church fence date. It took place in April of 2014. The minutes were corrected and then accepted.

Next, the Treasurer's Report was given by Kurt Heyman. The HHS continues to be in good financial health. Elden Plue moved to accept the Treasurer's Report, Duane Heyman seconded the motion, and the motion passed without dissent.

Nominations were taken to fill the expiring terms of Kurt Heyman, Neil Horn, Matthew Heyman and Ulrike Gapp. A motion was presented to re-elect the same group of four, was quickly seconded and passed unanimously.

Work on the Church at Hunt's Corners was the main topic of Old Business. The church was rewired in August of 2014. The church does need a new roof. The last roof was installed in August of 1987. William Seaman will get estimates for the roof replacement, and after

consultation with the entire board, will attempt to have the church roof replaced in the fall of this year.

After reporting on the status of the Society website and newsletter, Rachel Parrett asked the gathered crowd to supply her with stories for the newsletter. We continue to receive multiple donations, often with heartfelt notes

attached to those donations. The generosity of extended family members is much appreciated. The HHS continues to sell bricks for the sidewalk in front of the church. Since the last annual meeting we have sold 5 bricks.

Jackie Hyman spoke on the subject of the proposed 2020 Family European Trip. There is already much interest in the next Cousins overseas travel opportunity. The Society is going to give as much advance notice as possible for the next trip which will include visiting Kalten-

holzhausen as well as an opportunity to attend the Passion Play in Oberammergau, Germany.

In New Business, it was noted that the HHS still needs someone to take the lead for the family history book, which was last updated in 1997. Volunteers are needed and welcome. Painting of the church fence is an ongoing project.

At approximately 2:20p.m., Elden Plue moved the adjourn the meeting. Beth Horvatic seconded the motion, and the motion passed without dissent.

Minutes from Fall Board Meeting

The Fall Meeting of the Heymann Historical Society was held on Sunday, September 27, 2015 in Hunt's Corners, Ohio and was called to order at 1:55p.m. Board Members present included David Hyman, Duane Heyman, William Seaman, Kurt Heyman, Scott Bailey, Matthew Heyman, Neil Horn, Elizabeth Horvatic, Rachel Parrett, and Edward Rose. Those Board Members not present were Ulrike Gapp and Louis Zorn.

Minutes of the March 29, 2015 meeting were read by William Seaman and accepted as is. Neil Horn moved to accept the minutes, Beth Horvatic seconded the motion and the motion passed without dissent. Kurt Heyman then presented the Treasurer's Report. The financial health of the Heymann Historical Society continues to be strong. Duane Heyman moved to accept the Treasurer's Report, and William Seaman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The redecoration of the church was the first topic of discussion in Old Business. Whether to strip the paint from the pews in the church was discussed. The cost was a concern, and estimates had been sought. Rachel Parrett stated that there is a company in Toledo that will strip the pews, and then put four coats of varnish on, for \$345 per pew. After some discussion, it was the consensus of the group to paint the pews white instead. Beth Horvatic moved to do so, and her motion was seconded by Neil Horn. The motion passed without dissent. Rachel stated that sometime this fall she and her husband would begin to prep the interior of the church for painting. Rachel Parrett was also given the authority to rearrange any items currently in the church during her prep and painting for the purpose of making it a more consistent and attractive interior space.

The Board determined that the church should have a new roof in the immediate future to prevent damage to the structure. William Seaman was to get an additional quote for a 50-year shingle on the church roof, and he was given permission to pick the color of the roof shingle. Under the topic of the Society internet website and newsletter, Rachel stated she has established an email address for the society. It is heymanhistorical@yahoo.com. The alleged 100th anniversary of the reunion in 2017 and the 2020 European trip will be highlighted in the newsletter. Jackie Hyman spoke on the topic of the sale of gift items: . Multiple books have been sold, and the current price is \$50. Inventory is sufficient for most items. Jackie is looking for a new vendor for our ceramic items. 2016 prices will be increased slightly as postage costs continue to increase.

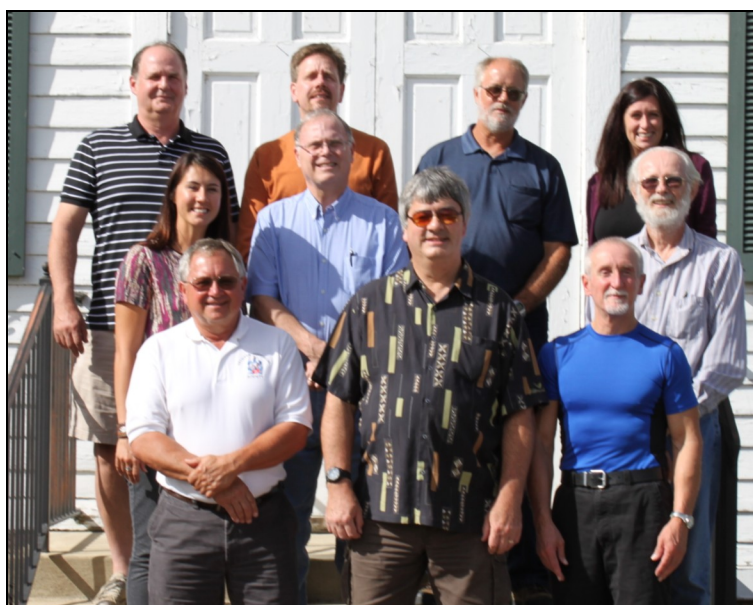

Jackie also mentioned the 2020 European trip. Twenty-one people have already signed up to receive information about the trip in 2020. Jackie is asking for a minimum and a maximum number of travelers allowed on the tour bus (for pricing and comfort on the coach) from tour guide Karl Schlederer. She will wait for Karl to get back to us with those numbers.

In New Business, the board discussed the desire to update the family genealogy. We are still waiting for a volunteer, or volunteers, to take on this enormous project.

The next order of New Business also focused on the propagation of the society through print. Ed Rose authored a book titled "The Heymanns of Kaltenholzhausen" and proposed that the society reprint the book for sale. Ed Rose's tome on the family goes back to the 1400s. If the print order was 50 copies, the approximate price would be \$24 per book. After some discussion, Rachel Parrett made the motion to print 50 copies of the book and promote the sale through the newsletter. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Another topic under the heading of New Business was the repainting of the HHS sign. Noah Heyman has taken down the Heymann Historical sign on the southeast corner of the church lot and will be repainting it.

It was mentioned that esteemed and long-serving board member, Lou Zorn, needs to be contacted to determine if he still wishes to serve on the board. Kurt Heyman will contact Lou Zorn to determine if he still wishes to serve. Bradley Smith and Marsha Adelman were put forth as possible successors if Lou Zorn chooses to retire.

We will invite our German cousins to the 2017 reunion. This will be the 100th anniversary of the John George Heymann reunion. We need to start planning with the Reunion folks now to have a significant celebration.

Duane Heyman moved that we ratify all actions of the board members in the past year. David Hyman seconded the motion and said motion passed unanimously. Adjournment of the meeting took place at 3:19p.m. William Seaman moved to adjourn the meeting. Neil Horn seconded the motion, and the motion passed without dissent.
