The Spring Meeting of the Heymann Historical Society was held March 29, 2015. Board members present were David Hyman, Duane Heyman, Kurt Heyman, William Seaman, Neil Horn, Matt Heyman, Beth Horvath, Rachel Parrett, and Scott Bailey. Lou Zorn and Ulrike Gapp were not present. Minutes of the September 28, 2014 meeting were read by William Seaman. Neil Horn made the motion to accept the minutes as is, and this was seconded by Duane Heyman.

The treasurer's report was presented by Kurt Heyman. Kurt went over the income statement, balance sheet, asset balances and inventory balances in detail. The finances of HHS are in good condition. David Hyman moved to accept the treasurer's report and Duane Heyman seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent. David Hyman made a motion for the Heymann Historical Society to provide a brick on behalf of Chase Heyman, our recently deceased board member. Neil Horn seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

In Old Business the Redecoration Committee mentioned that the painting of the interior of the church is tentatively set for June 2015. Rachel and her husband have volunteered to do that job. As stated earlier, after the painting is finished, carpet will be chosen by the committee and vetted via email to the entire board. Rachel also presented information on the matter of establishing an archival collection. Any grants received must benefit the Ohio Library Archival collection. We could donate our old or new books to the collection. Of most interest might be first person personal manuscripts we can discover. However, that research is probably going to be our responsibility. Jackie Hyman presented the report of gift item sales. Family history books are selling, as are DVDs created and produced by Duane Heyman. Our thanks go to him and his wife for their excellent photography. There was a suggestion that a portion of the red carpet be saved, which was so dear to Chase Heyman, and sold off in small pieces as a fundraiser.

In New Business the board discussed the loss of board member Chase Heyman. After some discussion it was determined that Ed Rose would make an excellent replacement for Chase. Duane Heyman made a motion to have David Hyman contact Ed Rose to complete Chase Heyman's term on the board. Neil Horn seconded the motion, and it passed with no dissenting votes. Saturday June 20, 2015 was set as the day to scrape and paint the fence around the church at Hunt's Corners. We are losing shingle integrity on the west side of the roof. William Seaman has been authorized to ask for estimates from Scott Schaeffer and Noah Yoder. We will ask for an estimate for tear off and replacement with 50 year shingles. Neil Horn made the motion to put this into action. Kurt Heyman seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. The last roof was put on the church in 1987. At 3:10 p.m. William Seaman moved to adjourn the meeting. It was seconded by Duane Heyman and the motion passed quickly and without dissent. ~Respectfully submitted by William Seaman, Secretary

In March of this year, founding Heymann Historical Society Board member Chase B. Heymann passed away after a short illness. Chase was involved with the HHS since its inception. Family and farming were integral to his long, rich life. Minutes from Fall Board Meeting

The Heymann/Heimann Historical Society held its Fall Meeting on September 28, 2014 in Hunt's Corners, Ohio at the Hunt's Corners Church. Roll was called at 1:42 p.m. David Hyman, Duane Heyman, William Seaman, Kurt Heyman, Chase Heyman, Neil Horn, Matt Heyman, Beth Horvatch, Rachel Parrett and Scott Bailey were present. Lou Zorn and Ulrike Gapp were not present. William Seaman gave the Secretary's Report. Minutes of the March 30, 2014 meeting in Grand Rapids, Ohio were read. Two corrections regarding who was present at the audit committee meeting and exactly where that meeting was held were made. The motion to accept the corrected minutes was made by Neil Horn, seconded by Duane Heyman and the motion passed without dissent. Kurt Heyman then gave the Treasurer's Report. Kurt went over the income statement for the current year versus the prior year. He also discussed the balance sheet, asset balances and inventory balances. The finances of the HHS continue to be strong. Duane Heyman motioned to accept the treasurer's report, and that motion was seconded by Neil Horn. The motion passed unanimously.

In Old Business, the Church redecoration committee gave their report. The church re-wiring was completed on September 26, 2014. Since that project was completed, the expected time that the interior of the church will be painted is sometime in the spring of 2015. Only after the painting is finished, will the carpeting be chosen and installed. Rachel stated the website will be updated with the trip data, and the newsletter will be heavily focused on the trip as well. Sales have been slow. We continue to be cognizant of not having too much inventory. Cookbooks will be sold at a \$7.50 price point. We need to encourage all our family members to purchase items. Duane Heyman will make DVDs of the most recent family trip for sale.

Jackie Hyman gave the report for the August 2014 family European trip. Jackie stated that it was a fabulous trip. Twenty-four people went with Karl Schlederer as the tour guide. Every single person was happy with the trip. The weather was warm in Italy, less so in Austria and Germany. Our German cousins gave a warm welcome to the trip members and the group was presented with a picture of Kaltenholzhausen in 1898. Dr. C. F. Hyman wrote a glowing thank you note to Jackie for the excellent work she did on the trip. The actual price was \$4,920 per person.

In New Business the preservation of the church organ was discussed. David Hyman will look into how to keep the organ warm during the oncoming winter. Ed Rose contacted the HHS. He has authored a family history, and asked whether HHS can promote a second printing of his database. Kurt Heyman moved to investigate this further, and Duane Heyman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. A gift from the Mayor of Kaltenholzhausen was returned to the church. Matt Heyman brought a plaque from the Kaltenholzhausen volunteer fire department to the board meeting. It was a gift from the Mayor of Kaltenholzhausen given to the family which visited there on September 26, 1993. It had found a home in the Grand Rapids volunteer fire department, was discovered and given to Matt. It is a substantial piece, owing to the fact it is allegedly reworked from the armor of a WWII tank. Chase Heyman then made a motion to ratify all the actions of the board over the last year. Duane Heyman seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Neil Horn moved to adjourn the meeting at 3:15 p.m. – this motion was seconded by all and passed quickly and again unanimously. ~Respectfully Submitted by William Seaman
