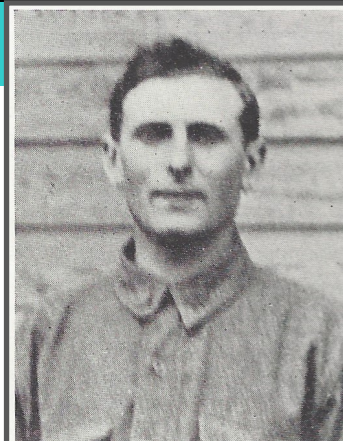

FAMILY HISTORY FROM 100 YEARS AGO...

One hundred years ago, the Great War was raging in Europe. Young men like Private Carl Heyman (pictured at right) were called to serve their country. Born less than fifty years after his grandfather (John George William Heymann) and his great grandfather (John George Heymann) came to this country from Germany, Private Heyman was sent overseas to fight against the German army. About eight months after entering military service, and just shortly after the war had ended, Carl died of influenza in Limbraga, Italy. Private Heyman's body was eventually returned to America, and on July 4, 1921 he was buried in the Hunts Corners cemetery east of Bellevue, Ohio near his great grandfather's grave. It is poignant for us to think about how John George Heymann gave up all that was familiar to him to give his family a chance at a better life in a new country. And how, not long afterwards, one of his descendants would return to the land of his forefathers to fight on behalf of this land of opportunity.

Minutes from the Spring Board Meeting

The Heymann Historical Society Spring Meeting was held on April 8, 2018 in Paulding, Ohio. Meeting was called to order at 1:20 p.m. Board members present were David Hyman, Kurt Heyman, William Seaman, Lanton Lee, Marcia Adelman, Beth Horvatich, Scott Bailey, Ed Rose, Rachel Parrett and Neil Horn. Board members not present were Ulrike Gapp and Duane Heyman. This was the first board meeting for Marcia Adelman and Lanton Lee – our two new board members.

William Seaman read the minutes of the October 1, 2017 meeting. One item was added to the minutes. Under old business, it was stated that Matt Heyman's construction company constructed the Friendship Hall in 1998. Neil Horn moved to accept the minutes with the addition, and Beth Horvatich seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent. Kurt Heyman presented the treasurer's report. In the usual manner, Kurt Heyman went over the income statement, the balance sheet, asset balances, contributions to the society for calendar year 2017, etc. The Society continues to be in sound financial condition. Beth Horvatich moved to accept the treasurer's report, Neil Horn seconded the motion and said motion passed unanimously.

In **Old Business** the Society Internet Website and Newsletter were discussed. Rachel Parrett spoke on these two topics. Rachel again pleads for items of interest. Rachel has been contacted by the Firelands Campus of Bowling Green State University. BGSU Firelands wants a speaker from our organization to give a presentation on the Heymann Historical Society. Gifts Received by the Society—Kurt Heyman had covered this in detail in his treasurer's report. An itemized list was given to each board member. Sales of Bricks and Gift Items—Jackie Hyman informed us that 39 books have been sold. For more informational purposes, no books will be shipped overseas. 2020 Cousin's Trip to Europe—Jackie Hyman covered this portion of the meeting as well. The itinerary is still wide open. Approximate departure date is the first Tuesday to the second Tuesday after the reunion. Probable departure airport is Detroit Metropolitan Airport – and probable destination is Frankfurt. Possible sites are Nuremberg, Munich, Dachau, Salzburg, the Eagles Nest, Oberammergau, the Black Forest, Neuschwanstein, and a side trip to France or Switzerland. Her advice to new travelers, start walking now. There are 35 reservations as of April 8, 2018 for the trip.

In **New Business** the Status of Board Members Lou Zorn and Duane Heyman was the first topic addressed. In order to make room for our newest board members, Lou Zorn graciously offered to resign from his position, and tendered his resignation in January 2018. William Seaman will contact Duane Heyman to get a health update. Documents from Our Church—Kurt Heyman received multiple documents from Nora Smith – detailing baptisms, marriages, meetings, etc. from the church prior to the Society assuming control in 1982. Our thanks to Nora Smith for being a good steward of these documents. Evergreen Trees in Northwest Corner of Church Lot—William Seaman will obtain estimate for potential removal of dying evergreen trees and present to board at the fall meeting. Kaltenholzhausen Church Pastor—Kurt Zander, minister at the church in Kaltenholzhausen, passed away in March 2018. Contest—Ed Rose suggested we post a challenge to each cousin to find the name of the ship that carried your ancestors to the United States. Potential prize mentioned was 23andMe genetic test. Videographer for the 2020 Trip—Beth Horvatich volunteered her husband (Marty) for this duty. We're not sure she checked with him first, but it's in print now, so it must be official! Horn/Heymann Family Tree—Neil Horn will be sending a free link of the Horn/Heymann family tree to each board member. At 3:11 p.m. Neil Horn moved to adjourn the meeting. Scott Bailey seconded the motion and it was quickly passed without dissent.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the HHS

The Annual Meeting of the HHS was held on December 10, 2017 in Hunts Corners, Ohio. Meeting was called to order at 1:19 p.m. – all members of the board were present with the exception of Ulrike Gapp and Lou Zorn. Present for the luncheon and their impending interviews were Lanton Lee and Marcia Adelman. The first order of business was the (re)election of four current board members to new three-year terms. David Hyman, Duane Heyman, Ed Rose and Beth Horvathich were unanimously approved for new three-year terms. Second order of business was the (re)election of the current slate of officers for an additional year. David Hyman – president, Duane Heyman – vice president, Kurt Heyman – treasurer and William Seaman – secretary – were unanimously approved for additional one-year terms. Third item of business was the discussion of the bid to paint the church. The bid was from Mr. Beatty – a Milan area painter who is expert in painting old homes and structures. The bid was \$12,000 total—\$1000 for materials, \$1000 to rent a lift to enable the painting of the steeple and \$10,000 to paint the church with two coats of high quality paint. After much discussion the bid was unanimously approved. The church will be repainted prior to the reunion in August 2018. Fourth item discussed was the status of our long time and much beloved board member Lou Zorn. William and Kurt were tasked with meeting, in person, with Lou Zorn to determine if he wishes to continue as a board member. This meeting will be arranged and held in January 2018. The fifth item mentioned was the date of the spring meeting in 2018. The tentative date was set for March 25th at the home of David and Jackie Hyman in Paulding, Ohio. [Editor's note – the meeting date was subsequently changed to April 8, 2018.] The sixth item shared was that the unaccounted inventory of the Heymann supplement was found in the home of David and Jackie Hyman. The last order of business was the in person interviewing of two individuals who wish to become board members of the Heyman Historical Society. Lanton Lee, from the Columbus area, was interviewed first. Marcia Adelman, from Monroeville, Ohio, was interviewed second. It was the judgment of the board that both individuals have the necessary skills and experience to be valuable members of the board. After William and Kurt speak to Lou Zorn and determine his intentions regarding his continued service, we will contact Lanton and Marcia and hopefully offer both of them positions on the board. The annual meeting was adjourned at 2:25 p.m.

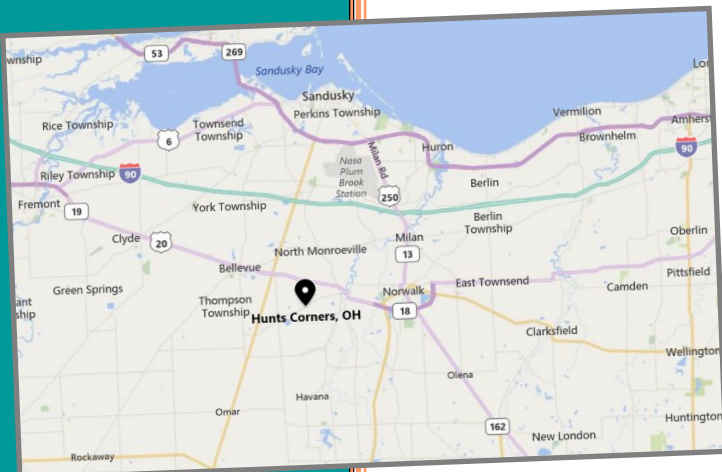
